INITIATION: Pursuant to section 243 of the New York City Charter, the Council is authorized to present, for inclusion in the executive budget without amendment by the Mayor, its operating budget. This document presents a summary description of the structure and presentation of the Council's budget, and sets forth the proposed Council budget for consideration and approval by the Finance Committee and the Council. Also included is a resolution for the approval of a lump-sum OTPS unit of appropriation.

In connection herewith, Council Member Justin Brannan offered the following resolution:

**RESOLUTION APPROVING THE FISCAL YEAR 2025
OPERATING BUDGET OF THE COUNCIL OF
THE CITY OF NEW YORK**

Resolved: By the Council of the City of New York, pursuant to the provisions of section 243 of the New York City Charter that the following amounts shall be submitted to the Mayor, for inclusion in the executive budget for the operating budget for the Council of the City of New York.

Summary:

Under the City Charter, the City Council is authorized to structure its own budget. This budget must be presented to the Mayor, for inclusion in the Executive Budget, after the Council approves it.

The Council's staff is described through divisions within three units of appropriation: Council Members and their aides, Committee Staffing, and Council Services. These and the standing committees each have a U/A for PS. OTPS is divided into the following categories: members, central staff, and each standing committee. A separate resolution approving the central staff's lump sum unit of appropriation is attached for Council approval pursuant to Section 100 (c) of the Charter.

Council Member office budgets are funded in U/A 001 object 021 (PS) and U/A 100 objects 400 (OTPS). Funds allocated for each Member's budget total \$521,000.

Staff from the Office of the General Counsel, Governmental Affairs, Finance, Land Use, Infrastructure, and Human Services divisions are specifically assigned to each committee and subcommittee. These analysts and attorneys in turn are supported by the Administrative Services Division, which functions as the central administration.

600 Committee on the Aging

Responsible for considering and proposing to the full Council legislation and resolutions for adoption, preparing committee reports, and conducting legislative oversight on matters in relation to the Department for the Aging and all federal, state and municipal programs pertinent to senior citizens. The committee has a Subcommittee on Senior Centers and Food Insecurity.

602 Committee on Civil and Human Rights

Responsible for considering and proposing to the full Council legislation and resolutions for adoption, preparing committee reports, and conducting legislative oversight on matters in relation to Human Rights Commission, Equal Employment Practices Commission, and Equal Employment Opportunity.

605 Committee on Civil Service and Labor

Responsible for considering and proposing to the full Council legislation and resolutions for adoption, preparing committee reports, and conducting legislative oversight on matters in relation to municipal officers and employees, the Office of Labor Relations, the Office of Collective Bargaining, the Office of Labor Services, and municipal pension and retirement systems.

610 Committee on Consumer and Worker Protection

Responsible for considering and proposing to the full Council legislation and resolutions for adoption, preparing committee reports, and conducting legislative oversight on matters in relation to the Department of Consumer Affairs and the Office of Nightlife.

615 Committee on Contracts

Responsible for considering and proposing to the full Council legislation and resolutions for adoption, preparing committee reports, and conducting oversight on matters related to the Procurement Policy Board, review of City procurement policies and procedures, oversight over government contracts, Mayor’s Office of Contract Services and collection agency contracts.

617 Committee on Criminal Justice

Responsible for considering and proposing to the full Council legislation and resolutions for adoption, preparing committee reports, and conducting legislative oversight on matters in relation to the Department of Correction and Department of Probation.

616 Committee on Cultural Affairs, Libraries & International Intergroup Relations

Responsible for considering and proposing to the full Council legislation and resolutions for adoption, preparing committee reports, and conducting legislative oversight on matters in relation to the Department of Cultural Affairs, libraries, museums, Art Commission, New York City Commission for the United Nations, Consular Corps and Protocol, Mayor’s Office of Special Projects and Community Events, and to encourage harmony among the citizens of New York City, to promote the image of New York City and enhance the relationship of its citizens with the international community.

620 Committee on Economic Development

Responsible for considering and proposing to the full Council legislation and resolutions for adoption, preparing committee reports, and conducting legislative oversight on matters in relation to the Economic Development.

625 Committee on Education

Responsible for considering and proposing to the full Council legislation and resolutions for adoption, preparing committee reports, and conducting legislative oversight on matters in relation to the Department of Education, School Construction Authority, and Charter Schools.

630 Committee on Environmental Protection, Resiliency and Waterfronts

Responsible for considering and proposing to the full Council legislation and resolutions for adoption, preparing committee reports, and conducting legislative oversight on matters in relation to the Department of Environmental Protection, Office of Long-Term Planning and Sustainability and Office of Recovery & Resiliency.

632 Committee on Finance

Responsible for considering and proposing to the full Council legislation and resolutions for adoption, preparing committee reports, and conducting legislative oversight on matters relating to executive budget review and budget modification, the Banking Commission, the Comptroller’s Office, the Department of Finance, the Independent Budget Office, and fiscal policy and revenue from any source.

633 Committee on Fire and Emergency Management

Responsible for considering and proposing to the full Council legislation and resolutions for adoption, preparing committee reports, and conducting legislative oversight on matters relating to the Fire Department/Emergency Medical Service (non-health related issues), and the Office of Emergency Management.

635 Committee on General Welfare

Responsible for considering and proposing to the full Council legislation and resolutions for adoption, preparing committee reports, and conducting legislative oversight on matters in relation to the Human Resources Administration/Department of Social Services, the Department of Homeless Services, and charitable institutions.

640 Committee on Governmental Operations, State & Federal Legislation

Responsible for considering and proposing to the full Council legislation and resolutions for adoption, preparing committee reports, and conducting legislative oversight on matters in relation to municipal governmental structure and organization, the Department of Citywide Administrative Services, the Office of Administrative Trials and Hearings, Community Boards, the Tax Commission, the Board of Standards and Appeals, the Campaign Finance Board, the Board of Elections, the Voter Assistance Commission, the Commission on Public Information and Communication, the Department of Records and Information Services, the Financial Information Services Agency, the Law Department, and state and federal legislation and home rule requests.

645 Committee on Health

Responsible for considering and proposing to the full Council legislation and resolutions for adoption, preparing committee reports, and conducting legislative oversight on matters in relation to the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene, Office of the Chief Medical Examiner, and Emergency Medical Services (health related issues). The committee has a Subcommittee on COVID Recovery and Resiliency.

647 Committee on Higher Education

Responsible for considering and proposing to the full Council legislation and resolutions for adoption, preparing committee reports, and conducting legislative oversight on matters in relation to the City University of New York.

648 Committee on Hospitals

Responsible for considering and proposing to the full Council legislation and resolutions for adoption, preparing committee reports, and conducting legislative oversight on matters in relation to public and private hospitals, and Health and Hospitals Corporation.

650 Committee on Housing and Buildings

Responsible for considering and proposing to the full Council legislation and resolutions for adoption, preparing committee reports, and conducting legislative oversight on matters in relation to the Department of Housing Preservation and Development, the Department of Buildings, and rent regulation.

652 Committee on Immigration

Responsible for considering and proposing to the full Council legislation and resolutions for adoption, preparing committee reports on issues affecting immigrants in New York City, and conducting legislative oversight on matters in relation to the Mayor’s Office on Immigrant Affairs.

654 Committee on Land Use

To ensure responsible use of City property, this committee considers and proposes to the full Council resolutions for adoption, prepares committee reports, and conducts legislative oversight on matters in relation to the City Planning Commission, the Department of City Planning, the Department of Information Technology and Telecommunications (land use related issues), the Landmarks Preservation Commission, and Land Use and Landmarks Review. The committee has two subcommittees: Zoning and Franchises; Landmarks, Public Siting, and Maritime Uses.

656 Committee on Mental Health, Disabilities and Addiction

Responsible for considering and proposing to the full Council legislation and resolutions for adoption, preparing committee reports, and conducting legislative oversight on matters in relation to mental health, developmental disabilities, addiction services, drug abuse, disability services, the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene (issues of mental health, development disability, and addiction services), and the Mayor’s Office for People with Disabilities.

657 Committee on Oversight and Investigations

Responsible for considering and proposing to the full Council legislation and resolutions for adoption, preparing committee reports, and conducting legislative oversight on matters in relation to the Department of Investigation, and to investigate any matters within the jurisdiction of the Council relating to property, affairs, or government of New York City.

660 Committee on Parks and Recreation

This committee is responsible for considering and proposing to the full Council legislation and resolutions for adoption, preparing committee reports, and conducting legislative oversight on matters in relation to the Department of Parks and Recreation.

665 Committee on Public Safety

Responsible for considering and proposing to the full Council legislation and resolutions for adoption, preparing committee reports, and conducting legislative oversight on matters in relation to the Police Department, the Civilian Complaint Review Board, Mayor’s Office of Criminal Justice, Courts, Legal Services, District Attorneys and the Office of Special Narcotics Prosecutor.

667 Committee on Public Housing

Responsible for considering and proposing to the full Council legislation and resolutions for adoption, preparing committee reports, and conducting legislative oversight on matters in relation to the New York City Housing Authority.

670 Committee on Rules, Privileges and Elections

Responsible for considering and proposing to the full Council legislation and resolutions for adoption and preparing committee reports on matters in relation to Council structure and organization and appointments.

671 Committee on Sanitation & Solid Waste Management

Responsible for considering and proposing to the full Council legislation and resolutions for adoption, preparing committee reports, and conducting legislative oversight on matters in relation to the Department of Sanitation and the Business Integrity Commission.

673 Committee on Small Business

Responsible for considering and proposing to the full Council legislation and resolutions for adoption, preparing committee reports, and conducting legislative oversight on matters in relation to the Department of Small Business services and matters relating to retail businesses and emerging industries.

675 Committee on Standards and Ethics

Responsible for considering and proposing to the full Council legislation and resolutions for adoption, preparing committee reports, and conducting legislative oversight on matters in relation to the Conflicts of Interest Board and Council ethics.

681 Committee on Technology

Responsible for considering and proposing to the full Council legislation and resolutions for adoption, preparing committee reports, and conducting legislative oversight on matters relating to the use of technology in New York City, Department of Information Technology and Telecommunications (non-land use-related issues), Mayor’s Office of Media & Entertainment, NYC-TV, and dissemination of public information through the use of technology.

682 Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure

Responsible for considering and proposing to the full Council legislation and resolutions for adoption, preparing committee reports, and conducting legislative oversight on matters in relation to Mass Transportation Agencies and facilities, Taxi and Limousine Commission, Department of Transportation and New York City Transit Authority, and the Department of Design and Construction.

683 Committee on Veterans

Responsible for considering and proposing to the full Council legislation and resolutions for adoption, preparing committee reports, and conducting legislative oversight on matters in relation to the Department of Veterans’ Services and other veteran related issues.

687 Committee on Women and Gender Equity

Responsible for considering and proposing to the full Council legislation and resolutions for adoption, preparing committee reports, and conducting legislative oversight on matters in relation to advancing the economic mobility, social inclusion, leadership and civic participation of women and girls, domestic violence, the Office to End Gender-Based Violence and the Commission on Gender Equity.

690 Committee on Children and Youth

Responsible for considering and proposing to the full Council legislation and resolutions for adoption, preparing committee reports, and conducting legislative oversight on matters in relation to the Administration for Children’s Services, the Division of Youth and Family Justice within the Administration for Children’s Services, Youth Board, the Department of Youth and Community Development, the Interagency Coordinating Council on Youth, and youth-related programs.
