Fiscal 2020 Budget. And as I said, at the handshake, this is a personal budget for me. It is my second as Speaker and it aligns with my guiding principal.

Which is do the most good for the people who need it most.

The City Council has a lot to be proud of in this budget. But before I highlight some of the victories, there are a lot of people that I need to thank and that all of us need to thank and I mean a lot. Adopting a \$92.8 billion Budget takes a team of dedicated, hardworking, knowledgeable professionals and here at the City Council, we have an abundance of people who fit that description.

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I will start with my dear friend, an amazing member of the City Council, as he said at the pre-stated press conference, the Queen of Queens, our Finance Committee Chair Dromm. I want to thank him for his amazing job. His hard work, his dedication, his long hours, Chairing those Executive Budget hearings. We are so proud of you Danny, so, so, proud of you. Congratulations.

I couldn't ask for a better partners. I also want to thank really just an amazing friend and colleague. Someone who takes this process very seriously but does it with a great sense of humor and a great disposition. Some one who has been a leader since her time starting here in the Council. I think in a united way, I am just supremely proud of the Chief of Staff here, who leads and helps run the City Council. I want to give a huge thank you to Jason Goldman, who has done an amazing job.

Because of this Council libraries will have an additional \$33 million for the critical services they provide every New Yorker and I want to thank Jimmy Van Bramer, the Chair of our Libraries and Cultural Affairs Committee.

Because of this Council, Parks will get a \$43 million investment for gardeners, maintenance workers, PEP officers, Urban Rangers, The Green Thumb Program and we are baselining 150 of those seasonal workers and gardeners. A huge investment. And I

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Because of this Council, our streets will be cleaner, because this year, we doubled the amount of funding for liter basket pickup throughout our city and I want to thank Antonio Reynoso, the Chair of our Sanitation Committee for his hard work and advocacy.

Since the handshake on Friday, which feels like three weeks ago. I have had some people say in reference to our budget agreement that pay parity didn't get it done and in a technical sense, they may be right in as much as the funding is not yet included in the budget, but I challenge that premise as missing the big picture.

What we have achieved on pay parity, is remarkable and transformational. Because of our advocacy, this Council's advocacy, unity and tenacity. For the first time, the city is on a clear and defined path in ensuring that our early childhood education workers, all of them, teachers and non-teachers alike, will be compensated equitably. These are predominantly women and predominantly women of color and the same is true of public defenders and

STATED MEETING OF THE NEW YORK CITY COUNCIL 25 civil legal service providers. I for one am thrilled at what we accomplished on pay parity in this city and through this budget.

I also want to highlight the Criminal Justice work that is funded in this budget, because it is an issue that is important in this moment, we are living in. New York City is on the forefront of tackling systemic disparities within our criminal justice system. And I am happy to say that \$54.5 million is being included for that purpose.

Some of the funding will support the expansion of supervised release. Now that we got the criminal justice reform's that were enacted at the state level and go into effect in January. And we are bringing Project Reset, which was borough wide in the Bronx, we are bringing it citywide. We are creating a brand new, in the first of its kind felony alternative to incarceration court part in Brooklyn with the Chief judge there. And we are adding 100 transitional housing beds for mentally ill male defendants to divert them from Rikers Island and get them the treatment and help that they need.

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We are providing the city's first major investment in programs and services for people involved in the sex trade to help them. And I want to congratulate my colleagues. We also got — I didn't want to list everything we are getting. I want to leave time for members to talk about it, but we got a huge investment for the young people of New York City, an expansion of 4,000 new compass slots. We restored the money on SONYC and work, learn and grow. We continue to fight for SYEP. We have been a champion for young people and for seniors through Margaret Chin's leadership as Chair of the Aging Committee.

We have fought for the vulnerable. We did it last year in securing fair fares. We've done it this year and the new money we received for things that are the most egalitarian things in New York City. Parks, Libraries and schools, things that touch and change New Yorkers lives every single day.

So, I am really grateful. I want to congratulate my colleagues. You all did great work. Before proceeding with today's votes, I will mention that in addition to the budget items we are voting on today, we are voting on one Article 11 Property Tax

Exemption in Council Member Espinal and Barron's districts. In Brooklyn to preserve 45 units of affordable housing and we are also voting on Introduction 1607 sponsored by our Transportation Chair Ydanis Rodriguez. Which will reduce the annual commercial motor vehicle tax imposed on Taxicab Medallions from \$1,000 to \$400.

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And with that, that concludes today's agenda. I look forward to proceeding with today's votes and Adopting a Budget that will be a champion for all New Yorkers to everyone who works so diligently to bring us here. There aren't enough thanks to express my gratitude.

I also want to mention, it wasn't in my remarks, but in ten days, we are celebrating the 50th anniversary of Stone Wall. The uprising at Stone Wall, which lit a match for worldwide equality in 1969 and led us on the path that we are on today.

Now, I have said it before and I know that Danny and Jimmy and Carlos and Richie have spoken of it as well, but none of us would be here today if it were not for the activists that came before us. There is still an epidemic of violence against LGBT people in the United States of America

Which lifted the shroud of uncertainly from the families and providers who didn't know until last week whether they would even have a summer program.

And \$14.2 million for comprehensive afterschool systems or Compass to serve 51,000 elementary school students and this funding was baselined. So, this means that families and providers will not be left in limbo from year to
