SERGEANT AT ARMS: Thank you. And good morning and welcome to today's remote New York City Council hearing of the Committee on Zoning and Franchise. At this time, would all council members and council staff please turn on their video? To minimize disruption, please place electronic devices on vibrate or silent mode. Thank you Chair, we are ready to begin.

CHAIRPERSON MOYA: Thank you. Good morning, I'm

Council Member Francisco Moya, Chair of the

Subcommittee on Zoning and Franchises. I am joined

remotely today by Council Members Ayala, Rivera,

Borrelli, and Brooks-Powers.

Today we will vote to approve Preconsidered LU's 738, 739 and 740 for the Arverne East Proposal, which was heard by this subcommittee on February 23rd. And which relates to property in Council Member Brooks-Powers's district in Queens. The proposal seeks a zoning map amendment affecting a portion of the Arverne urban renewal area, from a C44 district to a

2 special MX21 mixed-use district, as an M14R6

3 district.

A zoning text amendment to establish the new MX21 district, and the designation of the Urban Development Action Area, and approval of the Urban Area Development Action Project. The proposed actions would facilitate a mixed-use development with approximately 1,650 dwelling units, including 1,320 affordable, and 330 market rate units, 252,000 square feet of commercial space, 22,000 square feet of community facility space, 10,000 square feet of manufacturing space, 3.3 acres of privately owned recreation and open space, 15 acres of public open space, and approximately 1,765 parking spaces.

Council Member Brooks-Powers is in support of the proposal. But before I recognize Council Member Brooks-Powers, I'd also like to acknowledge that we have been joined by Council Members Levin and Reynoso. And with that, I'd like to one, welcome you Council Member to the City Council. It's great to meet you and congratulations on this project that you have right in front of you. What a way to start off your first week at the Council. So, I'd like to turn it over to you Councilwoman for some remarks.

COUNCIL MEMBER BROOKS-POWERS: Thank you so much Chair Moya. It's a pleasure to be here. So, today the Subcommittee will vote on the Arverne East Application Project, which has been a decades-long planning process. The proposed actions before the subcommittee will facilitate the construction of the Eastern portion of the Arverne urban renewal area, by designating the central portion of the urban renewal area as a nature preserve. And a new mixed-use district to facilitate the construction of a brewery.

I want to recognize the hard work and dedication my predecessor, now Borough President, has put into this project. This project was initially contemplated as a mixed-use development that was 80% market rate and 20% affordable. The first phase, including two buildings, will include approximately 500 affordable housing units, with 100 units set aside for families earning between 40% and 50% AMI. 100 units set aside for families earning 30% AMI and 75 units for the formally homeless population.

The applicant has agreed to meet the goal of 30% of the project. Contracts are given to MWBE's and an emphasis on local hiring within the Rockaway

Peninsula in the zip codes nearest the project site.

The applicant has also committed to working in good
faith with local labor unions during construction and
operation of the project site. The applicant is also
committed to working with our office and other local
stakeholders, to identify the best use of the 22,000

square footage of floor area reserved for community

8 facility uses.

I look forward to bringing the local community together to identify what use would be the highest benefit for the Rockaway community. I'm pleased that the administration has committed to working with my office to address the urgent need for new healthcare on the Peninsula.

The recent actions by The New York State

Department of Health to potentially convert Saint

John's Hospital into a micro hospital, underscores

the need for greater capacity. Having the second

deadliest zip code on the Rockaway Peninsula, which

was hardest hit by COVID, and prioritizing

preventative healthcare measures and additional

emergency capacity, are all sorely needed.

There are also — excuse me, sorely needed amenities to ensure we do not see the same inequities in how much harder COVID affected low-income

2 communities and communities of color in a future

3 health crisis.

I look forward to expediting the siting of this facility. And I will fight to see this project is responsive to the needs of the community. We are quite honestly at an inflection point, when we see this new development, and families still fighting to make ends meet. Far Rockaway is beautiful, resilient and determined. The residents have absorbed so much from Superstorm Sandy to this global pandemic.

We welcome all those who recognize our thriving community and wish to invest, reside, and become a fabric of the community. But we must be serious about more than 80 acres of city land to ensure we leverage it properly.

I have and will continue to fight for diversity, inclusion and equity. Strengthening the broadband infrastructure to shrink the digital divide, and a holistic community benefits agreement. These are important ingredients that are not found here at this time. But the developer team that consists of LNM, Bluestone and Triangle Equities, have committed to working with my office to ensure that these aforementioned issues and more are addressed post

2 haste. More importantly, the developer team has a

3 chance to prove why they're different. I have

4 decided to move forward to make this project better.

But under no terms will the needs of the community be

ignored.

just the beginning.

Finally, I thank the applicant for committing to meeting with The Community Advisory Board, to monitor the development and progress of this significant mixed-use development project. This is not the end of the planning process for this site, but really

I look forward to ensuring that this project is a benefit and not a burden on our community. As the project progresses, we will make sure that any nuances from construction and operation of the site are properly addressed by the applicant. In particular, I look forward to ensuring that the brewery located on the project site does not reduce the quality of life of neighboring residents and does impact any local school operations.

We desperately need more affordable housing, not just in the Rockaways but across the city. I urge my colleagues to vote yes on this application. I look forward to working with you in the very near future

forward to working with you. And I vote age on all.
