# The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

- Section 1. Subdivision c of section 19-170 of the administrative code of the city of New York, as amended by local law number 104 of the city of New York for the year 1993, is amended to read as follows:
- c. [A] 1. Except as otherwise provided in paragraph two of this subdivision, a violation of this section shall be punishable by the monetary fine authorized for violation of the rules and regulations of the commissioner in paragraph one of subdivision a of section twenty nine hundred and three of the New York City Charter.
- 2. A first violation of this section, when the commercial vehicle is a tractor-trailer combination, tractor, truck trailer or semi-trailer, shall be punishable by a monetary fine of two hundred fifty dollars. # NEW YORK STATE SENATE INTRODUCER'S MEMORANDUM IN SUPPORT submitted in accordance with Senate Rule VI. Sec 1

BILL NUMBER: S1861D

#### TITLE OF BILL:

An act to amend the administrative code of the city of New York and the vehicle and traffic law, in relation to increasing the fine for tractor-trailer combinations that park on residential streets overnight

### PURPOSE OR GENERAL IDEA OF BILL:

This legislation raises the parking fines for tractor-trailer combinations, large tractors, truck-trailers, and semi-trailers that are parked in New York City residential zones.

#### SUMMARY OF SPECIFIC PROVISIONS:

Section 1. Amends subdivision c of section 19-170 of chapter 5 of title 19 of the administrative code of the city of New York, to raise the fine for tractor-trailer combinations, tractors, truck-trailers, and semitrailers that park overnight on New York City residential streets to \$250 for a first offense and \$500 for each subsequent offense within a six-month period.

Section 2. Amends Vehicle & Traffic Law section 237(2) to authorize the City of New York to impose the traffic penalties provided for in section 1 of this bill.

## JUSTIFICATION:

The current fine for parking a commercial vehicle on a New York City residential street between 9pm and 5am is \$50. This small sum of money is of little deterrent value when compared to the costs of parking such vehicles in off-street parking sites. The current situation encourages many commercial vehicle owners to choose to illegally park their large truck-cabs and trailers on city streets over other less costly options. As a result, city residents find precious parking spaces occupied by illegally parked tractor-trailer combinations. This legislation seeks to alleviate this problem.

## PRIOR LEGISLATIVE HISTORY:

### FISCAL IMPLICATIONS:

Increase in revenue from parking fines.

Sixty days after it shall have become law.
