AN ACT to amend the New York city charter, in relation to imposing civil penalties for violations of the rules of the Brooklyn bridge park corporation relating to the government and protection of park and recreational property held by such corporation, providing for the adjudication of such violations by the environmental control board and clarifying the authority of the New York city department of parks and recreation with respect to such property

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Paragraph 9 of subdivision a of section 533 of the New York city charter, as amended by chapter 169 of the laws of 2002, is amended to read as follows:

9. to establish and enforce rules and regulations for the use, government and protection of public parks and of all property under the charge or control of the department, which rules and regulations so far as practicable shall be uniform in all boroughs and shall have the force and effect of law. Such rules and regulations shall apply to and shall be enforceable within public parks, recreational facilities and other property under the jurisdiction of the Hudson river park trust [and], the battery park city authority and the Brooklyn bridge park corporation provided that such trust [and], authority or corporation have entered into agreements with the commissioner to provide for the maintenance, protection and/or government of such property by the department, except to the extent that such rules and regulations are inconsistent with specific rules and regulations of the Hudson river park trust [and], the battery park city authority or the Brooklyn bridge park corporation.

(i) Any violation of such rules or regulations, except any violation of subparagraph (ii) of this paragraph, shall be a misdemeanor triable by a judge of the criminal court of the city of New York and punishable

by not more than ninety days imprisonment or by a fine of not more than one thousand dollars or by both. Any violation of such rules or requlations shall also subject the violator to a civil penalty of not more than ten thousand dollars for each violation which may be recovered in a proceeding before the environmental control board. 9-c. by agreement with the Brooklyn bridge park corporation (a notfor-profit corporation formed pursuant to section four hundred two of the not-for-profit corporation law), to enforce the rules and regulations of such corporation, relating to the use, government and protection of public parks and recreational facilities within the jurisdiction of such corporation. In addition to or as an alternative to any of the remedies or penalties provided under any other provision of law, violation of such rules and regulations shall be punishable by a civil penalty of not more than five hundred dollars for each violation, which may be recovered in a proceeding before the environmental control board. Such proceeding shall be commenced by a notice of violation returnable before such board. TITLE OF BILL:

An act to amend the New York city charter, in relation to imposing civil penalties for violations of the rules of the Brooklyn bridge park corporation relating to the government and protection of park and recreational property held by such corporation, providing for the adjudication of such violations by the environmental control board and clarifying the authority of the New York city department of parks and recreation with respect to such property

SUMMARY OF SPECIFIC PROVISIONS:

This bill amends the New York City Charter to clarify the authority of Parks Enforcement Patrol(PEP) officers to issue summonses returnable to the Environmental Control Board for the violation of rules of the New York City Department of Parks and Recreation. In addition, this legislation enables PEP officers to write summonses for violations of rules duly promulgated by the Brooklyn Bridge Development Corporation.

JUSTIFICATION:

The Parks Department has a contractual relationship with the Brooklyn Bridge Park to supply a certain number of Parks Enforcement Patrol ("PEP") officers in order to provide security services at Battery Park City and Hudson River Park. These arrangements have helped to establish the regular presence of PEP officers in all city parks, including the above two -locations, which are not owned by the city. Indeed, these arrangements further the uniform application of the familiar New York City Parks Rules and provide for the consistent enforcement of such Rules over almost all parks in the City. Moreover, the presence of PEP officers in these locations assists the Parks Department in responding to emergencies throughout Manhattan.

The proposed amendment to the City Charter would firmly establish the Parks Department's ability to enforce its Rules in public parks, recreational facilities, and other property under the jurisdiction of public corporations, public benefit corporations, public authorities, and instrumentalities thereof which have entered into agreements with Parks.

The amendment is necessary to clarify Parks' jurisdiction allowing PEP officers to issue summonses returnable at the Environmental control Board, which is the normal procedure for most, violations of Parks Rules and regulations.

Section 1. Paragraph 9 of subdivision a of section 533 of the New York city charter, as amended by chapter 169 of the laws of 2002, is amended to read as follows:

9. to establish and enforce rules and regulations for the use, government and protection of public parks and of all property under the charge or control of the department, which rules and regulations so far as practicable shall be uniform in all boroughs and shall have the force and effect of law. Such rules and regulations shall apply to and shall be enforceable within public parks, recreational facilities and other property under the jurisdiction of the Hudson river park trust [end], the battery park city authority and the Brooklyn bridge park corporation provided that such trust [ex], authority or corporation have entered into agreements with the commissioner to provide for the maintenance, protection and/or government of such property by the department, except to the extent that such rules and regulations are inconsistent with specific rules and regulations of the Hudson river park trust [and], the battery park city authority or the Brooklyn bridge park corporation.

TITLE OF BILL: An act to amend the New York city charter, in relation to imposing civil penalties for violations of the rules of the Brooklyn bridge park corporation relating to the government and protection of park and recreational property held by such corporation, providing for the adjudication of such violations by the environmental control board and clarifying the authority of the New York city department of parks and recreation with respect to such property

<u>SUMMARY OF PROVISIONS</u>: Section 1 of the bill amends paragraph 9 of subdivision a of section 533 of the New York City Charter to apply rules and regulations of the New York City Department of Parks and Recreation to parks, recreational facilities and other property under the jurisdiction of the Brooklyn Bridge Park Corporation.

Section 2 establishes the remedies and penalties for violations of rules and regulations on public parks and recreational facilities under the jurisdiction of the Brooklyn Bridge Park Corporation. Adjudication of violations of such rules would be before the Environmental Control Board.

Section 3 provides that the act would take effect immediately.

REASONS FOR SUPPORT: This bill amends the New York City Charter to clarify the authority of Parks Enforcement Patrol ("PEP") officers to issue summonses returnable to the Environmental Control Board for the violation of rules of the New York City Department of Parks and Recreation. In addition, the legislation enables PEP officers to write summonses for violations of rules duly promulgated by the Brooklyn Bridge Park Corporation.

The Parks Department is finalizing an agreement with the Brooklyn Bridge Park Corporation to supply PEP officers in order to provide security services at Brooklyn Bridge Park. This arrangement helps to establish a regular presence of PEP officers in this park, which is jointly owned by New York City and New York State. This arrangement furthers the uniform application of the rules of the NYC Department of Parks and Recreation and provides for the consistent enforcement of such rules over almost all parks in New York City.

The proposed amendment of the New York City Charter would firmly establish the authority of the Parks Department to enforce its rules in Brooklyn Bridge Park. Similar Charter amendments were made with respect to public parks under the jurisdiction of the Hudson River Park Trust and the Battery Park City Authority.

Accordingly, the Mayor urges the earliest possible favorable consideration of this proposal by the Legislature.
