2	CHAIRPERSON	COMRIE:	Good	morning.
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Today is July 28, 2010. I will be officially married 20 years at 5:00 today. I hope I make it. Yeah, you know we got married at 5:00 on the 28th so, thank you. That's true, that's true. Let's stay on topic, let's actually get on topic. We'll see. We are holding a full Land Use committee meeting today. We are joined by council member Halloran, council member Levin, Mendez, Garodnick, Williams, sorry, Reyna, Jackson, Koo, Lander, Palma, Arroyo and Vacca and also the subcommittee Chair Weprin.

We are here to go over a few items.

Brad Lander? Oh Seabrook, Larry Seabrook. We are doing a few items on the calendars today. Land

Use items number 136 through 145 dealing with

Flushing Commons in council member Koo's district.

It's dispositions amendment to the zoning maps, special permits, zoning texes [phonetic] and UDAPs for Macedonia Plaza. There are ten related actions to facilitate the proposed construction of a mixed use development on the site of the municipal parking lot in Flushing, Queens. This will include a 1.5 acre publicly accessible open

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2 space, YMCA, parking, small retail, market rate
3 housing and low income housing.

We have Land Use number 148c, 100259HUK, the Bathgate renewal plan in council member Foster's district, community board 3, council district 16, there's a proposal amendment to an urban renewal plan to facilitate the construction of a nine story building with supportive housing. We also have Land Use number 149 item number C03023ZMQ, 35th Avenue rezoning in council member Koo's district. Next item number 150C050522ZMK, 94th Street Corona Avenue rezoning in council member Ferrara's district and private application to allow rezoning to allow construction of 2 seven story mixed use buildings. Land Use number 151C100180PCM, in council member Quinn's district, regarding the site selection acquisition of the highline related structures encasement to facilitate the expansion of the highline public open space.

We have Land Use item LU
15320105584HKM, the proposed landmarking of a
building in the speaker's district located at 104
West 40th Street. Three sidewalk cafes, Land Use

5	place out. Land Use item number 154 Picante in

8	Land Use item 155 in council member Chin's
9	district, an unenclosed sidewalk café located at
10	212 Lafayette Street. We have some UDAPs, Land
11	Use item number 7120105417HAK, council member
12	Arroyo's district. This is the motion to file
13	pursuant to withdrawal. Land Use item number
14	7220105418HAX, council member Foster. Land Use
15	item number 7320105419HAX in council member
16	Viverito's district, motion to file pursuant to
17	withdrawal. Land Use item number 75201054218HAM
18	council member Jackson, it's a TIL. Land Use item
19	number 76201054228HAM, council member Jackson and
20	it's also a TIL, Land Use item number
21	10620106624HAK, council member Dilan. And I know
22	that council member Koo wanted to say a few words
23	about the Flushing Commons project. I'll say a
24	few words after we've been joined again by council
25	member Sanders and council member Dickens has

2 arrived also. Council member Koo?

3 COUNCIL MEMBER KOO: Thank you 4 Chairman Leroy. First I have to thank Chairman 5 Leroy and committee subchair Mark Weprin for their help and their guidance and also I have to thank 6 the administration, Robert Goldrich and their help 7 8 and essential staff here, Carol and Gail and Amy. And this is a long process and this is my first 9 10 year as a city councilman so I first felt 11 intimidated by this big project but as times goes 12 on I felt a little more comfortable with the help 13 from administration and from our staff and my colleagues. I'm a small businessman and I won't 14 15 do anything to hurt fellow business people in my district, that's for sure. I have a small 16 pharmacy right across the street from the projects 17 18 only a hundred feet away. It's very close and my 19 pharmacy is really busy. I don't want to kill my 20 business for this project so by the same token I'm 21 doing my best to help my fellow business people 22 among the area to make sure that business is okay, 23 it's vibrant and I'm sure after the project's finished our businesses will increase because when 24 25 the tide rise, all the boats rise too. So I don't

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want to take too much time I just want to thank my
collagues for supporting this wonderful project.
This will be a win win for everybody for the

community and for the city. Thank you.

CHAIRPERSON COMRIE: Yeah, sorry, again I want to thank all of the people who worked on this project. This is a project that as I said earlier that has been worked on for over six years. It spanned two council terms. It spanned many involvement of different sets of people. I want to thank council member Mark Weprin for all of his work as a subcommittee chair. Yes, he's over there hiding because he's tired and he wants to move on from this project. On to the next big one so and Rob Goldrich, Hayden Maholtiz [phonetic] and all of the people in the Mayoral administration that worked on the project. to thank Peter Koo's office again for all the work that they did to try to bring the project to its highest level of support for the community and the small businesses that would be affected.

I want to remind people that there is over a hundred million dollars in amenities that the developer is adding to the project that

2	will be permanent. Everything from the Y to a
3	permanent public space that will be usable space.
4	Not a space that is inaccessible, it will actually
5	be 24 hour public space that people can walk
6	through, sit in, relax in and also listen to down
7	the line concerts and other public events that can
8	happen in that space. And I think that I am
9	comfortable with encouraging all of the members to
10	vote aye on this project. Would any other members
11	like to speak on projects that are within their
12	district? Seeing none, I would encourage an aye
13	vote on all items on today's agenda remembering
14	that aye vote is also a motion to withdraw on Land
15	Use items 71 and 73. So proving the motion to
16	withdraw. With that we'll will ask the committee
17	clerk to call the roll.

me congratulate Peter Koo for going through a very

2	rigorous process very early in his tenure at city		
3	council. He's worked and his staff have worked		
4	diligently to try to accommodate a very very broad		
5	spectrum of interests. I'm glad to see that the		
6	Mayor's office came to the table to discuss with		
7	the Chair Comrie and Chair Weprin all of the		
8	concerns that have been raised. I look forward to		
9	Peter's continued guiding of this project as it		
10	goes through. I am confident that if anybody can		
11	understand the plight of the small businesses in		
12	the district, it's him. I will be voting aye.
