PROPOSED INTRO. NO: 165-A

COMMITTEE: Sanitation and Solid Waste Management

TITLE: A local law to amend the administrative code of the city of New York, in relation to recycling in public and private schools.

SPONSORS: The Public Advocate (Mr. De Blasio) and The Speaker (Council Member Quinn) and Council Members Barron, Brewer, Dromm, Fidler, James, Koppell, Lander, Lappin, Mark-Viverito, Palma, Rodriguez, Vann, Williams, Rose, Eugene, Jackson, Nelson, Gennaro, Van Bramer, Levin, Recchia and Chin

SUMMARY OF LEGISLATION: Proposed Int. No. 165-A would create separate requirements for schools under the jurisdiction of the Department of Education (DOE) as well as private and parochial schools that are not under DOE's jurisdiction. The bill would require the Chancellor of the Department of Education to designate a sustainability coordinator who would set policies, guidelines, and goals for waste prevention, reuse, and recycling in public schools, charter schools, and other facilities under DOE's jurisdiction that receive collection service from the Department of Sanitation. Each school would then be required to develop a site-specific waste prevention, reuse, and recycling plan, with the principal or his or her designee acting as the school's sustainability coordinator. Each school would be required to complete an annual survey detailing compliance with the waste prevention, reuse, and recycling plan by January 1, 2011, and the Chancellor would prepare an annual report assessing the rates of recycling and compliance with site-specific school waste prevention, reuse, and recycling plans Citywide.

EFFECTIVE DATE: This local law shall take effect immediately.
