Today we are going to vote on

Proposed Intro 270-A, which would establish a

Silver Alert program in the city to help find

older adults with cognitive impairments who go
missing. Really, I can't think of anything more
terrifying as a caregiver than watching your
parent or grandparent who has Alzheimer's or
dementia and having them wander off and being
worried for their safety.

We held a hearing on this bill back in June and all who came to testify voiced their strong support for this legislation. Just a very quick recap, Intro 270-A, which Council Member Maria del Carmen Arroyo and I have introduced together, would require the mayor to designate a specific city agency to implement a Silver Alert program.

The administering agency would be responsible for issuing an alert within 24 hours of a senior with cognitive impairments being reported missing to the police department. It would develop a protocol to notify organizations like the media, senior centers, senior service providers, medical facilities and community organizations that a senior with dementia or Alzheimer's has been reported missing.

The information would be conveyed

through means such as email, phone calls, TV or radio broadcasts. The alerts would also have to be issued repeatedly until the missing person is found or the agency determined that it would no longer be appropriate to continue.

We amended the bill, and this is something I wanted to note. This is something that came up at the hearing. It's to make the program a little bit more flexible because we heard testimony that people who can have Alzheimer's or dementia may not be 65 or older and we would still want it to apply to them, so it will.

I think this bill is a very sound way for New York to take another step towards improving its age friendliness. Silver Alerts are a lot like Amber Alerts. They have been proven to be successful in many other parts of the country. I think 26 other jurisdictions, city or states, have already enacted them. I have no doubt that it will be a success here as well.
