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2	CHAIRPERSON RECCHIA:	Okay.	I

know, Nick, I know, I'm going to give you a Jerry, you got it under control? right. Thanks for our Sergeant-at-Arms. morning, welcome to today's Finance Committee hearing. My name is Domenic M. Recchia, Jr., and I'm the Chair of this wonderful Committee, and I welcome everyone to this hearing this morning. Before we move further, I'd like to introduce all my colleagues who are here and who have joined us today. We have Fernando Cabrera, Jimmy Van Bramer, Joel Rivera, Diana Reyna, Karen Koslowitz, Lewis Fidler, and as other members arrive, we will recognize them. Today we have two items on our agenda. One bid and one transparency resolution. Let's start with the bid item. As you may remember, on December 8th this Committee approved the resolution said today is the day to consider a local law that would authorize an increase in the budget of seven bids, therefore increasing the amount of assessment for each property owner with the bids. The budget increases for the seven bids are being made at the request of the bids, the seven bids that will see a budget increase are

125th, 103rd Avenue, I think Maria Carmen Arroyo's
district, 125th Street is Inez Dickens', Bergen
Beach bid is, is Mike Nelson and Domenic Recchia
by adoption. [laughter] They're right across the
street from me, that's why. The Myrtle Avenue in
Brooklyn by Tish James; the Fashion Center,
Speaker Quinn; the Fifth Avenue, Speaker Quinn;
and Times Square in Speaker Quinn. All of the
Council Members in the respective bids have
submitted letters of support for the budget
increases. Pursuant to the bid law, increasing
the amount to be expanded annually for
improvements, services and maintenance requires
the adoption of local law by the City. Such a
local law may be adopted by the City Council after
the determination that it is in the public
interest to authorize such an increase, and that
the tax and debit limits prescribed in the bid law
will not be exceeded. Pursuant to the bid law,
the budgets of bids cannot exceed 20 percent of
the total real property tax as levied in the year
of the budget increase request. The Fiscal 2011
property tax levy is \$18.2 billion, therefore the
budget of each bid that seeks a budget increase

2	cannot exceed \$3.7 billion, which I can assure my
3	colleagues it does not. [laughter] The amount of
4	the bid increases is in your briefing packet.
5	Okay? We're good, we have SBS Jeremy's here,
6	Deputy Commissioner who's going to testify. Just
7	let me, I have a little bit more reading to do.
8	On, now I'm just going to go over the transparency
9	resolution, which mostly makes technical
10	corrections to designations in Schedule C, the
11	Resolution will make a change to designation in
12	Fiscal 2011/2010 expenses budget. Council Members
13	should have these list changes and in some cases
14	additions which is attached to the Resolution.
15	For clarification purposes, we know that
16	organizations appear in the Resolutions that have
17	not yet completed the prequalification process
18	conducted by the Mayor's Office of Contracts and
19	by the Council, or any other government agency,
20	are identified in the attached charts with an
21	asterisk. Additionally, as with all transparency
22	resolutions, Council Members will have to sign a
23	disclosure form indicating whether or not a
24	conflict exists. And if a conflict does exist
25	before you vote, you should make that public.

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2	Okay? Representatives from Council Finance are
3	available to answer any questions you may have
4	regarding the transparency resolution. And
5	Jeremy, Deputy Commissioner from SBS, will now
6	Assistant Commissioner, will now talk. It can be
7	brief

JEREMY WALDROP: Yes, sir.

CHAIRPERSON RECCHIA: --and to the

point.

JEREMY WALDROP: Good morning, Mr. Chairman and Members of the Finance Committee. Again, I'm Jeremy Waldrop, with a cold, Assistant Commissioner at the Department of Small Business Services. SBS supports the law providing an increase in the amount to be expended by the seven business improvement districts. As required by law, the seven bids have published a notice of the public hearing, at least once, in a local newspaper having general circulation in the districts, specifying the time when and the place where the hearing will be held; and stating the purpose, the proposed amount to be expended annually. In addition, the bids certify that they have mailed a letter to property owners informing

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them about the proposed assessment increase, and the time and place of this public hearing. The City's bids supplement City sanitation and public safety services, promote businesses through marketing initiatives and public events, enhance the City's physical environment through streetscape improvement projects and engage local communities through student internship programs. In addition, bids in partnership with the City government help create jobs, improve the quality of life of New Yorkers and visitors, enhance the City's tax base and strengthen the local economy in these tough economic times. Thank you.
