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CHAIRPERSON RIVERA: Thank you very 2 much, ladies and gentleman. We're now going to 3 begin the Committee on Rules, Privileges and 4 5 Elections. Good morning. My name is Joe Rivera. I'm the chair of the Committee and before we 6 begin, let me introduce the members who are here with us today. To my left, we have Council Member 9 Robert Jackson, Council Member Liz Crowley, 10 Council Member Leroy Comrie, Council Member Karen 11 Koslowitz. To my right, we have the Minority 12 Leader Council Member Jimmy Oddo, we have Council 13 Member Lew Fidler, Council Member Inez Dickens, Council Member Al Vann, and we're also joined by 14 15 Lamon Bland and Chuck Davis from the Committee and 16 also entering is Vincent Gentile.

Today we will be considering the advice and consent and designation of three candidates and changes to the rules of the Council concerning the procurement procedures. Before us we have Charles McFaul, a Democrat Mayoral candidate for appointment to the Civil Service Commission. If the Council gives its advice and consent, Mr. McFaul will replace Simon Gourdine, a Democrat, and serve for a six-year term that

CLERK: Good morning. Do each of you swear or affirm that your statements will be truthful to the best of your knowledge?

CHARLES MCFAUL: Yes.

ANNA KRIL: Yes.

CHAIRPERSON RIVERA: Thank you.

First we will begin with Mr. McFaul. I will briefly explain the functions of the Civil Service Commission. The Commission consists of five members with not more than three being from the same political party. The mayor, from a list provided by the Screening Committee, makes the appointment. Members have a six-year term and are reimbursed on a per diem basis of \$387.17 for the chair and \$355.50 for other members for attendance at scheduled meetings.

The Commission's duties include
hearings and determining appeals from any
aggrieved person from a decision by the
commissioner of the Department of City-Wide
Services, who is responsible for city-wide
personnel matters. The Commission may affirm,
modify or reverse such a decision. The Commission
also has all the powers and duties set forth in
the State Civil Service Law. The Commission
either on its own or at the request of the mayor,
Council or DCAS commissioner may conduct reviews

1 or studies of the administration of personnel in 2 the city, including the classification of titles. 3 4 Do you wish to make an opening statement, Mr. 5 McFaul? CHARLES MCFAUL: Yes, a brief 6 7

opening statement if I may. Good morning, Chairman Rivera and members of the Committee. As indicated, my name is Charles McFaul. I appear before you today as a candidate for appointment to the New York City Civil Service Commission.

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I'd just like to give you a brief introduction to my background and experience. Suffice it to say that my professional career has been in the public service. I began my position in 1970 as an administrative—as an assistant corporation counsel with the New York City Law Department. I followed that with positions with two New York State agencies-the State Division of Criminal Justice Services and then, the New York State Office of Court Administration.

In 1979, I was appointed as an administrative law judge with the Office of Administrative Trials and Hearings, which is more commonly known as OATH, here in the city. During

my tenure at OATH, I served as both the chief judge and as a deputy chief judge under four different mayors. I retired from my position at OATH last year.

As my resume I think makes clear, my prior positions have been both managerial, administrative and legal work and the bulk of my experience has been in administrative law with an emphasis on the civil service law and the administration of a central administrative tribunal.

I believe that this experience will service me well should the Committee decide to recommend my confirmation to the full Council.

Thank you very much.

CHAIRPERSON RIVERA: Thank you very much. Next we'll move on to Ms. Kril. I will briefly explain the functions of the Health and Hospitals Corporation. HHC is a public benefit corporation charged with the duty of providing high-quality, dignified and comprehensive healthcare and treatment to the public, especially to those who cannot afford such services.

HHC's board of directors consists

of 16 members who administer HHC. Included within the board's membership, in addition to the 5 ex officio members, are ten appointees of the mayor, 5 of whom are designated by the Council for consideration by the mayor. The term of office for directors is five years with a vacancy filled under the terms of the original appointment.

Directors are not compensated, but are reimbursed for actual expenses. At this point in time, do you wish to make an opening statement?

ANNA KRIL: I would simply say that first of all for me, it is an absolute privilege and honor to serve on the board for HHC. I was born in Bellevue Hospital. I am a product of our public health system. I know how important our delivery of healthcare is to the poor of our city and the amazing strides that are being made day in and day out to deliver the finest healthcare possible to all, in spite of ethnic or economic strata. So I am impassioned to see that our public health system continues to do the job it's supposed to do, which is to help all of our New Yorkers who need care. Thank you.

CHAIRPERSON RIVERA: Thank you very

5	ALPHONZO GRANT: Just briefly.
6	Good morning, Chairman Rivera-

9	briefly explain the functions of the Civilian
10	Complaint Review Board. I apologize.
11	The Civilian Complaint Review Board
12	(CCRB) is independent from the City's police
13	department and charged with the duty to
14	investigate complaints of misconduct by police
15	officers toward the public. Board members are
16	required to reflect the city's diversity. The
17	board consists of 13 members, 5 designated by the
18	Council for appointment 5 adopted by the mayor and
19	3 designated by the police commissioner, which are
20	the only members who have law enforcement
21	experience.
22	CCRB has a civilian staff
23	responsible for conducting investigations of

responsible for conducting investigations of complaints received by the board. CCRB jurisdiction is limited to claims claiming

excessive force, abuse of authority, discourtesy
or use of offensive language. The board operates
in panels of at least three members. All CCRB
members are eligible for compensation on a per
