SERGEANT-AT-ARMS: Good morning. This is a microphone check for the Committee on Aging. Today's date is February 8, 2024, located in the Committee Room, recording done by Pedro Lugo.

Can everybody settle down? We're getting ready to begin.

Good morning and welcome to the Committee on Aging.

At this time, can everybody please silence your cell phones?

Chair, we are ready to begin.

CHAIRPERSON HUDSON: [GAVEL] Thank you so much and good morning and welcome to today's Aging Committee vote.

I'm Council Member Crystal Hudson,
Committee Chair, and my pronouns are she/her.

Shortly, the Committee will vote on a proposed Preconsidered Introduction sponsored by Council Member Eric Dinowitz which would require the Department of Housing Preservation and Development or HPD to provide application forms prepopulated with applicant information for the Senior Citizen Rent Increase Exemption program, also known as SCRIE, to potentially eligible Mitchell-Lama residents.

The Committee last held a hearing on this
Introduction two weeks ago. I appreciate the
Administration's input on this important piece of
legislation that can close the SCRIE enrollment gap
and allow more older New Yorkers to age in place with
dignity.

I'll now turn it over to Council Member Dinowitz for brief remarks.

COUNCIL MEMBER DINOWITZ: Is it that kind of morning?

CHAIRPERSON HUDSON: It's that kind of morning. I apologize.

COUNCIL MEMBER DINOWITZ: Good morning.

Thank you, Chair. Thank you for, of course, bringing this to a vote and to all the Committee Members here.

I'm really proud to be here today as this
Committee votes on my bill, Introduction 25-A, which
was introduced last term. As the Chair said, aging in
place with dignity is a critical value that we live
by and act by in this Council. This bill will require
HPD to provide eligible New Yorkers living in
Mitchell-Lama apartment buildings with prefilled
SCRIE applications.

Affordable housing and support for older adults are two causes of significant value, both to myself and my District. The SCRIE program is crucial to supporting both, but it is not being utilized as much as it could. Our City agencies have access to the information that deems a Mitchell-Lama resident eligible for the SCRIE program. Why sit around and wait for our older adults to apply when we can take a proactive approach now? We must make a greater effort to understand the needs of the aging population and support their well-being. No person should be forced out of their home while in retirement due to a lack of affordability, and this bill brings us one step closer to eliminating this in New York City.
