CHAIRPERSON AYALA: [GAVEL] Good morning everyone and welcome to today's hearing. My name is Diana Ayala, and I am the Deputy Speaker of the New York City Council and Chair of the General Welfare Committee.

Today, our Committee will be voting on Preconsidered Resolution 4. The bill will authorize the Speaker to commence legal action on behalf of the Council for the City of New York to compel the Mayor and his Administration to implement Local Law 99 of 2023, Local Law 100 of 2023, Local Law 101 of 2023, and Local Law 102 of 2023, the CityFHEPS expansion laws.

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The Mayor's outright refusal to implement legislation that will serve as a long-term solution to the city's homelessness crisis is short-sighted at best. This political act is yet another example of poor governance. As I've said before, while the Mayor repeatedly speaks about the strain that the City's budget is currently experiencing, his Administration has done very little to expedite the move-out of those in shelter and into permanent housing. The bills we passed are cost-effective methods to reduce some of that strain and to create similar pathways for people experiencing homelessness in our city. The Mayor has both a moral and a legal duty to implement them.
