CHAIRPERSON SALAMANCA: [GAVEL] Good

afternoon and welcome to the Committee on Land Use. I

am Council Member Rafael Salamanca. I Chair this

Committee.

I would like to welcome my esteemed

Colleagues who have joined us today. We've been

joined by Council Member Rivera, Chair Riley, Brooks
Powers, Abreu, Majority Leader Farías, Chair Hanks,

Hudson, Sanchez, and Borelli.

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I would like to thank Chair Riley and
Chair Hanks for their work on our two Subcommittees.

Today, we will vote to approve the

Brownsville Arts Center and Apartments project under

LU numbers 15, 16, and 17, related to property in

Council Member Mealy's District in Brooklyn. The

proposal includes a zoning map amendment, a zoning

text amendment, a designation for an Urban

Development Action Area, and a related UDAAP

approval, and related disposition of the development

site. These actions will facilitate the development

of a nine-story mixed-use affordable housing building

with ground floor community space in Brownsville.

Council Member Mealy is in support of this project,

and now I will recognize Council Member Mealy for

some comments.

Salamanca. I was very happy to lend my support to the Department of Housing Preservation and Development, HPD, Brownsville Arts Center and Apartments application. Our neighborhood is in need of deeply affordable housing, and this development is 100 percent affordable housing. I was able to push HPD to commit to removing the 80 percent AMI tier from the

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development so that all units are at or below 70 percent AMI.

The community asked for larger apartments, and I was able to get HPD to commit to increase the size of all the apartments including subsequently increasing the size of the living rooms and in the apartments.

It's important that the community be able to use the spaces in this building. I was able to push HPD to develop and offer free time in these spaces to the community groups, and they have agreed to provide 20 hours per month free to the community groups.

As my community knows, parking is a challenge. This project was not able to include parking because of the ground floor space is being used for the community organizations and art organizations, but I informed HPD that something needed to be done. I was able to secure commitments from the Department of Transportation to review the street regulations in and around this project. As a preliminary commitment, they have agreed to make 10 new on-site overnight parking spaces available on East New York and Dumont Avenue.

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Finally, I pray and I'm glad to provide
this for the community and celebrate Brownsville
community for no doubt that the Brownsville Arts
Center will generate opportunities for so many of my
community members and the youth who are interested
dance, art, and music.

I want to thank all my Colleagues for supporting this project with me. I want to thank our Majority Leader Farías, Chair Salamanca, and Chair Hanks for indulging me in all these hours, and I want to thank all of my Colleagues if you could vote in support of this project. Thank you, and I support this project.
