4	everyone, and welcome to the hearing of the
5	Committeeoh, good morningon Sanitation and
6	Solid Waste Management, I am Chair of the
7	Committee, Council Member Letitia James. I've
8	been joined to my far right by Council Member
9	Jackson; to my immediate right, Council Member
10	Maria Carmen Del Arroyo; andand Council Member
11	Sara Gonzalez all the way to my left, who's not
12	there in, in physical form, but her spirit is
13	there. [laughs] Today we will vote out of
14	Committee Proposed Intro 287-A. This bill strikes
15	a balance that will improve quality of life while
16	preserving street cleanliness for many New
17	Yorkers. It will allow local communities, as
18	represented by their community boards, to
19	determine the appropriate relationship between
20	alternative side parking and street cleaning. I
21	encourage my, my colleagues to vote yes, and I
22	thank obviously the staff, Jarret Hova, who is
23	fabulous; Daniel Avery, the Senior Policy Analyst;
24	Kate Seely-Kirk, Senior Legislative Financial
25	Analyst; and Nicole Kolinsky. I also want to

colleague and I, we both teamed up on this bill. 2 When enacted will reduce alternate side parking to 3 two days if sanitation districts achieve a 90 4 5 percent cleanliness rating. I am aware that the Uniform Sanitation Workers Union has concerns. 6 And I have spoken to Sanitation Union President Harry Nespoli personally to address his concerns 9 and their concerns. Furthermore, I have expressed support for my Sanitation brothers and sisters, 10 11 and I have indicated and said to them that we can 12 work with them, as well as Department of 13 Sanitation, the Commissioner, Administration, so 14 that hopefully they can look to expand garbage 15 pickup on routes along new and growing commercial 16 corridors, as well as utilize workers to augment 17 graffiti cleaning. Through this joint effort, 18 many community boards across the City, including my own--Sunset Park, Board 7; and Red Hook, Board 19 20 6--will be able to reduce their alternative side parking. I just want to say that not only that 21 22 parents come home, and they're driving around for 23 hours and hours, trying to get home, it takes 24 sometimes two hours to park your car. You have 25 children to attend to in the mornings and the

3	means cars idling would mean emissions and
4	environmental problems. So I think this is a
5	quality of life issue, as well. And of course,
6	dealing with the idea that if a district is clean,

9	wonderful thing moving forward. I'm very glad,
10	and I urge my colleagues to vote yes. Thank you.
