problem that has been going on in this City for

too long, and has defied solution. Every single
day we have people in this City who are denied
service by a taxicab because of what they look
like, or because they need to get to one of the
so-called "outer boroughs." This practice is not
just against the law, it is completely
unacceptable. All New Yorkers have a basic right
to hail a cab anywhere in the five boroughs. Yet,
the stories are too common. And they are too
often ending up with passengers getting left out
in the cold, or worse. Specifically, Intro 521
raises the penalties for three violations:
refusing to take a passenger to a destination
within the five boroughs; requesting the location
of where a passenger wishes to go prior to that
passenger entering a taxi; and overcharging a
passenger. The current fines for all three
violations max out at \$350 for a first offense and
\$500 for a second offense. This bill would
increase the maximum penalties to \$500 for a first
offense and \$1,000 for a second offense. Repeat
offenders would still face license revocation upon
a third offense within 36 months. In addition,
they would now face a fine of up to \$1,000 for the

third offense. I do want to point out one change
to today's version of Intro 521. At the urging of
colleagues, this section of this bill that
would've raised fines for livery cabs that pickup
illegal hails, has been removed so that maximum
fines will remain where they are today. I want to
briefly, I want to rather be perfectly clear, we
have a problem with, in this City with livery
cabs, and illegal street hails, and all New
Yorkers need to know that this is an issue in this
City. They are taking a risk when they hail a
non-yellow cab. But the reality is that in many
parts of New York City right now, taxis are simply
not available, and cannot be found, and therefore
we are holding off on implementing this fee
increase at this time. Finally, before I move for
a vote, I want to thank the Mayor and TLC
Commissioner David Yassky for putting forth the
legislation, as well as Council Member Rose, who
has been staunch advocate of taxi passenger
rights, and who will be now commenting on this
legislation. INo? Oh, Council Member Rose is
waiving her right, and I thank you, we all thank
you, Council Member Rose. [laughter] I welcome
