CHAIRPERSON RIVERA: Good

afternoon, ladies and gentleman. Welcome to the State and Federal Legislation Committee. My name is Joe Rivera, and I'm a member of the Committee and I will be chairing today's hearing for Council Member Helen Foster, who cannot be here today. As you know, the session in Albany is ending and we are presented with another opportunity to pass home rule legislation that affects the City of New York. First, I would like to introduce the members who are here with us today. We have Council Member Lew Fidler, Council Member Erik Dilan, Council Member Domenic Recchia and we are also joined by Council Member Robert Jackson.

This afternoon the Committee will be voting on several items. The different issues before us may seem unrelated, but taken together, they reflect a concerted effort to ensure that the State and City governments are working to serve the needs of the people of this great city. We will be considered two bills that deal with commercial bicyclists. One piece of legislation would require stricter enforcement of the administrative code provision regulating

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2	commercial bicyclists. It will also hold
3	businesses vicariously liable for the actions of
4	commercial cyclists that they employ.
5	Additionally, we will be considering legislation
6	that will require commercial bicyclists to
7	register with their local police precinct and wear
8	helmets. This will contribute to the safety of
9	both the bicyclist and to pedestrians as well.
10	We've also been joined by Council Member Liz
11	Crowley. We will also consider park nation
12	legislation in Astoria. At this moment, I would
13	like to open the hearing to any comments or
14	statements from any of the Committee members.
15	Seeing none, we will move forward. We will now
16	open the hearing to-there are no witnesses that
17	are being presented today, so at this point in
18	time, I will ask the clerk to please call the
19	roll, and I recommend an aye vote on the items on
20	today's agenda.

Community Outreach with the New York City Department of Parks and Recreation. Thank you for

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the opportunity to testify on the home rule on the Committee's agenda today that would affect New York City's parks. The legislative item as it relates to Parks is a resolution requesting the New York State Legislature to pass bills introduced by Senator Gianaris and Assembly Member Simotis, which would authorize the City of New York to discontinue use of certain parkland and convey it to St. Michael's Cemetery in Queens. The park land that is being referred to is a 3.77 acre strip of land adjacent to the cemetery. alienation action is subject to the requirement that the City use any proceeds and/or land received in exchange for the conveyance authorized by this act to acquire land for park purposes in an amount equal to or great than the fair market value of the land being conveyed.

At this time no replacement park

land has been identified in order to adopt

alienation legislation. The Parks Department is

not aware of a replacement parcel to evaluate in

order to ensure that the replacement parcel is of

sufficient size and open space value as the park

land proposed for alienation as is customary for a

2	one to one acre replacement value for the park
3	land alienated. Given the uncertainty surrounding
4	the replacement park land, the fair market value
5	of the land to be conveyed to be established as
6	per the legislation may not be sufficient to
7	acquire replacement parkland to replace the open
8	space value of the alienated park parcel. It
9	would thus be premature to adopt alienation
10	legislation prior to reaching agreement on all
11	aspects of the land swap and the Parks Department
12	is opposed to this piece of legislation at this
13	time. We take the alienation of park land very
14	seriously and after only extensive dialogue and
15	negotiation. Passing this legislation without
16	identifying replacement park land sets a very
17	dangerous precedent. I thank you for the
18	opportunity to testify before you today and I'd be
19	happy to answer any questions you may have.
20	CHAIRPERSON RIVERA: Thank you very
21	much. I don't have any questions. Thank you.
