I serve as the Chair of the New York City

Committee on Contracts. It is my pleasure to

6 welcome you today. Thank you all for attending.

Today the Committee will vote on two Introductions and two Resolution concerning the procurement of local food and the reduction of packaging materials for food and other goods.

These pieces of legislations are proposed Intro

No. 452-A sponsored by Council Member Gale Brewer, proposed Intro No. 461-A sponsored by Council

Member Annabel Palma, Resolution 627 sponsored by Council Member Debbie Rose, Resolution 628 sponsored by Council Member James Sanders. In

November of last year, Council Speaker Christine Quinn released Food Works, a comprehensive plan that set forth a vision for a more sustainable food system in New York City. The Food Works plan proposed reform and addressing the agriculture

production processing, distribution and
consumption of food, as well as post consumption
opportunities to reduce waste. The four bills and
resolutions that we will vote on today are pieces
of legislation arising from the Food Works vision
that on gity progurement

Proposed Intro No. 452-A will require the City to establish guidelines to encourage agencies to make best efforts to produce food grown, produce harvest or process in New York State. The legislation would also require the City to monitor agencies' implementation of these guidelines.

Proposed Intro No. 461-A will require the City to establish packaging reduction guidelines for us and all City agencies' contracts in order to minimize the waste and connection with the city's procurement of goods.

Resolution No. 627 calls upon the State to expand its law allowing New York City to preference food originating from New York State to include a preference for original food from nearby states, including New Jersey, Connecticut, Massachusetts, Vermont and New Hampshire.

Resolution No. 628 calls upon the
State to regulate the amount and type of packaging
used to incase foods, goods produced by the state
and its localities, including New York City.
Council Member Brewer could not attend today's
hearing, but she sent her statement, and she asked
me to read it aloud.

Statement in support of 452a, local food procurement, Gale A. Brewer, City Council,
July 26, 2011. I thank Speaker Christine Quinn and her staff who have long advocated for healthier, locally sourced food for all New
Yorkers and who have supported Intro 452-2011. I also thank Renea Cavolick [phonetic] from my staff, who is an expert of food of local source and healthier foods, as well as Contracts
Committee Chair, Darlene Mealy.

This bill, which is an outgrowth of Speaker Quinn's Food Works report, would require the City's chief procurement officer to encourage city agencies to make best efforts to purchase New York State food. It would also require the chief procurement officer to report on city's efforts to purchase New York State food as well as provide

2	tracking information related to food procurement.
3	The bill does not advocate more costly food and it
4	would not apply to emergency or small purchases.
5	Most importantly, by procuring locally grown food,
6	the city would reduce transportation costs, reduce
7	its vulnerability to short term price and the
8	international food market, help improve the
9	environment and support regional farms by
10	improving their sustainability. Thanks to Renea
11	Cavolick, I have organized several meetings with
12	the Department of Education on healthier food for
13	students, and together we were working on a plan
14	to purchase locally within the DOE budget. Thanks
15	to Speaker and Education Chair Jackson. We also
16	held a hearing on the topic. Although 452-A
17	cannot legally include DOE purchasing, it does
18	focus on all other city agencies, such as the
19	Department of Homeless Services, the Department of
20	Correction and others who purchase in coordination
21	by the Department of City-Wide Administration
22	Services.

Because we want to help local farms and New York City agencies become partners in meeting the city's demands for fresh, local foods,

we organized a New York State larm and
infrastructure tour on July 7, 2011. Working with
Cornell University, we toured farms and processing
facilities all of which have the volume to become
viable partners with the city agencies. I was
delighted that the chief procurement officer from
DCAS joined us. He is a new member of the senior
staff and was very impressed with our local farm
and packaging capacity and he will be returning to
the upstate area for more discussions. In
conclusion, I thank Chair Mealy for this hearing,
and I urge you to vote for 452-A, so that we can
be successful in bringing locally sourced food to
city agencies.

We want to thank Gale Brewer for this lovely letter. We can acknowledge now Mark-Viverito. We would like to have in hearing American Chemistry Council urges support for proposed Intro 461-A, packaging reduction. We thank them. Again, thank you all for attending. Would you like to have anything to say? Council Member Jackson? Any members? With nothing further, let's move on to our vote. We will begin with proposed Intro No. 452-A, Council Member Brewer's
