serve for the remainder of a one-year term
expiring on August 31<sup>st</sup>, 2012; Paula Berry, a

Brooklyn resident appointment by the mayor to the
Waterfront Management Advisory Board to serve for
the remainder of a one-year term expiring on

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August 31<sup>st</sup>, 2012; Michael Northrop, a Brooklyn resident appointment by the mayor to the Waterfront Management Advisory Board to serve for the remainder of a two-year term expiring on August 31<sup>st</sup>, 2013; Dr. Susan Klitzman, a Brooklyn resident reappointment by the mayor to serve to the Board of Health to serve for the remainder of a six-year term expiring on May 31st, 2014. Dr. Sixto Caro, a Manhattan resident reappointment by the mayor as a member of the Board of Health to serve on the remainder of a six-year term expiring on May 31<sup>st</sup>, 2016; and Elizabeth Knauer, a Brooklyn resident who is being considered for appointment by the mayor to the Environmental Control Board as the mayor's board member with experience in the field of water pollution control to serve for the remainder of four-year term that expires on March 5<sup>th</sup>, 2013. Due to the large number of candidates and small space in the Committee room, we will interview the candidates in two groups. The first group will be the Waterfront candidates and the second group will be the Board of Health and Environmental candidates.

I will briefly explain the

functions of the Waterfront Management Advisory
Board. The Board serves as an advisory body to
the deputy mayor for Economic Development, the
commissioner of Small Business Services and the
City Planning Commission concerning any matters
relating to the industrial, commercial,
residential, recreational or other use of wharves
waterfront property and waterfront infrastructure
in the city. The Board consists of 17 members,
the deputy mayor for economic development is
chairperson, the commissioner of Small Business
Services is vice chair, the chairperson of the
City Planning Commission, 1 City Council Member
designated by the City Council and 12 members to
be appointed by the mayor with the advice and
consent of the City Council, provided that there
is at least one appointed member from each
borough. Appointed members shall include
representatives of labor, the maritime industry,
the transportation industries, the real estate
industry, the hospitality industries and as well
as environmental advocates and community
advocates. Welcome, we'll have Laura Axelrod
[phonetic], our committee chairperson, swear you

CHAIRPERSON COMRIE: Alright. Do
we have any questions for any of the candidates
for the Waterfront Commission from any of the
members? Okay. Well, I want to thank you all for
your service and then, I will ask you to go back
to your other seats, so we can have the other
candidates come up. Thank you. The reason
nobody's asking you any question is because you
all have great resumes and a great service
background, so don't take it personally. You've
already been thoroughly vetted.

Now can we have the candidates for the Board of Health and the Environmental Control Board to come forward? Can you all raise your

LAURA AXELROD: Do you swear or

CHAIRPERSON COMRIE: Okay. going to just explain the functions of the Board of Health for the record. The main function of the Board is to promulgate the New York City Health Code, which encompasses any matter within the jurisdiction of the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene. The Department has jurisdiction to regulate on all matters effecting health in the city, including but not limited to mental health, mental retardation, alcoholism and substance abuse related needs of city residents. The scope of the Department's jurisdiction includes such diverse disciplines as communicable diseases, environmental health services, radiological health, food safety, veterinary affairs, water quality, pest control and vital statistics. Besides the chairman, the Board consists of 10 members. Also, we'll just talk about the Environmental Control Board really quickly. Within the New York City Office of Environmental

Trials and Hearings, known as OATH [phonetic],
there is an Environmental Control Board (ECB) that
adjudicates notices of violation issues by various
city agencies, including the Departments of
Environmental Protection, Police, Sanitation,
Health and Mental Hygiene, Fire and Buildings.
ECB has the power to render decisions and orders
and to impose civil penalties under the law
provided for such violations. ECB may apply to a
court of competent jurisdiction for enforcement of
any decision, order or subpoena that it issues.
ECB consists of the commissioners of the
Departments of Environmental Protection,
Sanitation, Health and Mental Hygiene, Buildings,
Police, Fire and the chief administrative law
judge of OATH, as well as six persons appointed by
the mayor with the advice and consent of the
Council. The chief administrative judge of OATH
serves as chair of ECB. Members other than agency
commissioners may not be employed by the city.
Five of the six non-commission members must
possess broad general background and experience;
one in each of the following areas: air pollution
control, water pollution control, noise pollution

2 control, real estate or the business con	ommunity
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3 The sixth non-commission member represents the

4 general public. Members other than the agency

5 commissioners are compensated and receive \$175.10

6 per diem when performing the work of ECB.

With that, I want to thank... Ms. Knauer's experience to make sure that she doesn't represent herself before the Board primarily, while she serves on the—or her firm, that she may be involved with.
