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Dispositions and Concessions. We're going to have a very brief hearing today in the recess of the Landmarks Hearing. I'm Council Member Stephen Levin, Chair of the Subcommittee joined today by my colleagues, Charles Barron of Brooklyn and Peter Koo of Queens. We are hearing one item today, Land Use No. 499, a proposal subject to Council review and action pursuant to the Urban Development Action Area Act, Article 16, New York General Municipal Law at the request of the Department of Housing and Preservation and Development. This is non - - number 20125161 HAK, and includes a number of addresses in Brooklyn, that is 106 Hopkinson Avenue, 237 Sumpter Street, 220 McDougal Street, 2019 Fulton Street, 728 Madison Street, 766 Herkimer Street, 516 Crescent Street, all in the borough of Brooklyn in Community Districts 3, 16 and 5. The program is neighborhood stabilization and the Council Members for these addresses are Council Member Darlene Mealy and this Subcommittee's own Charles Barron. Testifying on these items Carol Clark Assistant

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afternoon, Mr. Chairman and members of the Subcommittee. I'm joined by my colleague, Peter Madden, of the Office of Development and you noted, L.U. 499 is the proposed amendment of four city-owned vacant lots that are located at the addresses that you cited that were previously approved for disposition. This action also consists of amending a tax exemption that was previously approved for a series of vacant lots, and in total, these seven lots comprise the newly proposed project known as Hopkins and Sumpter. The sponsor Mutual Housing Association of New York proposes to construct seven buildings containing 26 units of affordable rental housing. Council Member Barron has indicated his support. He has one of those lots in his district. The other six are still under discussion with Council Member Mealy. Thank you.

CHAIRPERSON LEVIN: We've also been joined by Subcommittee Member, Inez Dickens of Manhattan. Do any of my colleagues have any
