3	morning everyone, and with that gavel we are						
4	now in session, the Committee on Cultural Affairs,						
5	Libraries, and International Group Relations. We						
6	are here this afternoon to vote on Intro 711-A and						
7	as Chair of the Committee I was pleased to						
8	introduce this expansion of the Library Card Act,						
9	which would require city agencies to make						
10	available library card applications for young						
11	people who access their services. It's my goal and						
12	I believe all of our goals to have every young						
13	person in the city of New York have a library card						
14	in their pocket at all times. This legislation						
15	will continue to expand the number of people who						
16	receive library card applications from the city						
17	agencies that most interact with children that						
18	would most benefit from accessing our public						
19	library systems. On November 30^{th} of last year,						
20	this Committee heard Intro 711 and expansion of						
21	the library card act of the bill has subsequently						
22	been amended. As amended the expansion would						
23	require the Department of Education to distribute						
24	library card information to pre-kindergarteners.						
25	The proposed bill would also require other city

2	agencies serving children, including the						
3	Administration for Children's Services, the						
4	Department of Homeless Services and the Department						
5	of Youth and Community Development as well as the						
6	Human Resources Administration to make available						
7	library card information a variety of for						
8	young people accessing Since the passage of						
9	the initial library card act, over 150,000 young						
10	people in the city of New York have received						
11	library cards. Millions more have had library card						
12	applications in their hands, and we are excited to						
13	vote on this piece of legislation. We have 22 co-						
14	sponsors and I urge all of my colleagues to vote						
15	in favor of Intro 711-A, the expansion of the						
16	Library Card Act. So with that, I recommend a yes						
17	vote and ask for the roll call.
