sent correspondence indicating their support for
designation, and we designated on June $12^{ m th}$, and I
am ready to answer any questions you may have.

CHAIRPERSON LANDER: Thank you very much. Council Member Arroyo, are you supportive of this designation of this also? This very nice historic firehouse.

COUNCIL MEMBER ARROYO: I am.

CHAIRPERSON LANDER: Outstanding.

Any other members have questions? Seeing none,
there's no members of the public who have signed
up to testify, with that we'll close the public
hearing on this item and move to our next, which
is Land Use #668, application 20125790, the Hotel
Mansfield in Speaker Quinn's district at 12 West
44th Street.

Intergovernmental and Community Relations for

Landmarks Preservation Commission here to testify

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on the Commission's designation of the Hotel 2 Mansfield, now the Mansfield Hotel, in Manhattan. On March 27th, 2012, the Landmarks Preservation 4 Commission held a public hearing on the proposed designation, one witness testified in favor of designation, and on June 12th, the Commission voted to designate the building a New York City Individual Landmark. I'll be happy to answer any questions you may have.

CHAIRPERSON LANDER: Thanks so much, if we had more time I'd ask about why they changed it from the Hotel Mansfield to the Mansfield Hotel, but for today I'll just note that as folks can see from the designation report, clearly worthy of designation and preservation, Speaker Quinn supports it, as do members of the community. Any questions? No one has signed up to testify, so we'll close the public hearing on this item and move on to Land Use #669, 20125791 ... excuse me, all right, so let me ... yes, so we're actually laying that item over, to folks who are following along on the agenda, Land Use #669, 20125791, the Yorkville Bank Building in Council Member Lappin's district is being laid over to our

designation of the Martha Washington Hotel in

12 Manhattan. On July 12th, 2011, the Landmarks

13 Preservation Commission held a public hearing on

14 the proposed designation. There were two speakers

in favor of designation, including the owner and a

16 representative of the Historic Districts Council,

17 no speakers in opposition. I don't know if you

want me to go through the differences when we de-

19 calendared a part of the site? Okay. On June

20 12th, 2012, the Landmarks Preservation Commission

21 voted to designate the entire lot 26, the

22 Landmarks site was amended on June 19th, 2012 to

23 include only the land on which the described

building is located. On June 12th, 2012 the

25 Commission voted to designate the building a New

2 York City Individual Landmark.

CHAIRPERSON LANDER: Thank you. As you know, we're always very encouraged when the owner comes to the Commission and speaks in favor, and acts as a good steward of outstanding (inaudible). Any questions? Seeing none, and noting that the owner spoke at the LPC in favor, along with other supporters and we have no one here today, I will close our public hearing on this item, and we'll move on to our final landmark item on the calendar, which is Land Use #671, application 20125794, also a firehouse, Firehouse Engine Company 305 and Ladder Company 151 at 111-02 Queens Blvd. in Council Member Koslowitz's district.

Queens. On May 15th, 2012 the Landmarks

Preservation Commission held a public hearing on

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the proposed designation as a landmark of the firehouse. There were five speakers in favor of designation, correspondence in support of designation was received from the Fire Department, the City of New York, and from Queens Borough President Helen Marshall. There were no speakers in opposition to designation, and on June 12th, the Commission voted to designate the building a New York City Individual Landmark, I'll be happy to answer any questions you may have.

CHAIRPERSON LANDER: Thank you. In deference to our two Queens members, I will note that I think this may be the nicest of the three firehouses that we're designating today. All right, I take it back. Any questions? No, and we have no one from the public signed up to testify, again note that the Fire Department as well as multiple other Queens advocacy and civic groups spoke in favor. Seeing no one, we will close the public hearing on this item as well, and thank Ms. Fernandez for her testimony and her patience. And we'll move to our final item on the calendar for today, those were all Landmarks items, this is a public siting. This is Land Use #682, application

13 Estate Transaction Services Group. I'm pleased to

14 be here to provide background on the proposed

15 lease amendment for a maritime use, EDC is seeking

16 a lease amendment on behalf of the Department of

17 | Small Business Services that would allow for the

18 extension of an existing lease with Sea Traveler's

19 Marina for two additional ten-year terms. The

20 site is located at 2875 Flatbush Avenue boat

21 basin, no new structures or uses are proposed at

22 this site and the original lease with Sea

23 Traveler's was approved by the Council in 1996. A

24 portion of the area currently leased by Sea

25 Traveler's is contemplated to be surrendered back

to the city upon EDC's closing of the sale to

Baikal Development, and that portion will be

conveyed to Baikal, the disposition of Baikal

Development which will provide for the

construction of the new home of Crystal Autumn
while it was approved by the Council in May of

this year. Thank you for your time and I'm happy

9 to answer any questions you may have.

you very much, I'll note for the record that
Council Member Fidler is in support of this
action, and as you noted that the sort of
corresponding disposition has already been
reviewed and approved separately by the Council
earlier this year. Any questions? Folks looking
for a marina berth? All right, that's great, and
most of the ... this sort of furnishes boats that
are in Jamaica Bay and the environs.

MR. PADRON: Correct.

CHAIRPERSON LANDER: Very good, all right, well, seeing no questions and also seeing as no one has signed up to testify at the public session, we appreciate EDC's maintaining our waterfront maritime infrastructure and bringing us
