| 2 | COUNCIL MEMBER NELSON: Welcome to |
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| 3 | today's meeting of the Committee on welcome to |
| 4 | today's meeting on Civil Service and Labor, |
| 5 | December 14 th , 2012. We are going to vote on reso |
| 6 | wait a second. Oh it is, on reso #1352, calling |
| 7 | upon employers in New York City to hire more |
| 8 | workers over 55 years of age. The Chair is |
| 9 | running late, he's going to be here I hear any |
| 10 | minute, and we have members with us, Council |
| 11 | Member Gennaro, and Melissa Mark-Viverito, and |
| 12 | Council Member Domenic Recchia will be with us |
| 13 | very shortly, as well as the Chair. (pause) |
| 14 | COMMITTEE CLERK: Are we on? Are |
| 15 | we on? Can we go? |
| 16 | COUNCIL MEMBER NELSON: And Council |
| 17 | Member Recchia is here, and we're going to take |
| 18 | this up, reso #1352 to a vote, thank you. |
| 19 | COMMITTEE CLERK: William Martin, |
| 20 | Committee Clerk, roll call vote, Committee on |
| 21 | Civil Service & Labor, Resolution 1352, Council |
| 22 | Member Nelson. |
| 23 | COUNCIL MEMBER NELSON: Aye. |
| 24 | COMMITTEE CLERK: Gennaro. |
| 25 | COUNCIL MEMBER GENNARO: Yes. |

| 6 | COMMITTEE CLERK: By a vote of four |
| 7 | in the affirmative, zero in the negative and no |
| 8 | abstentions, the item is adopted. |
| 9 | COUNCIL MEMBER NELSON: We'll hold |
| 10 | the vote open now for one half hour, it's now |
| 11 | 1:22. Thank you. And a correction, it's 1:42. |
| 12 | COMMITTEE CLERK: Continuation roll |
| 13 | call, Council Member Ulrich. |
| 14 | COUNCIL MEMBER ULRICH: I vote aye, |
| 15 | and I want to commend the prime sponsor of the |
| 16 | bill, Council Member Lappin, for helping older New |
| 17 | Yorkers gain employment, and for helping people in |
| 18 | this very rough economy, I think it's great work. |
| 19 | I'd like to be added to the bill as well. And I |
| 20 | want to thank the Committee Chair, thank you, I |
| 21 | vote aye. |
| 22 | COMMITTEE CLERK: The vote now |
| 23 | currently stands at five in the affirmative. |
| 24 | CHAIRPERSON SANDERS, JR.: This |
| 25 | Committee will now come to order. Good afternoon, |

| and my name is Council Member James Sanders, Jr., |
|--|
| and I'm the Chair of the Committee on Civil |
| Service and Labor. This will sadly be my last |
| hearing as the Chair of this Committee, as I am |
| leaving the Council to go join the State Senate |
| this September. Ah, just checking, I'm glad |
| you're right. I won't wait until September, I |
| can't wait and the needs of the people cannot wait |
| either, we will join in January, not September. |
| It would be nice to be off. It has been a |
| wonderful experience sharing this important |
| Committee and I know the Committee and its work |
| will continue without me. Today we are voting |
| upon Resolution #1353, 52, Resolution 1352, which |
| calls upon employers in the City of New York to |
| hire more workers 55, over 55 years of age, and |
| since I'm there or approaching, I like that idea, |
| let's hire more. Did you know, sir, that |
| approximately one million, or 12%, of the City of |
| New York city residents are over age 60? |
| MALE VOICE: I was unaware of that. |
| CHAIRPERSON SANDERS, JR.: Wow, a |
| figure that is projected to increase by 50% in the |
| next 20 years. This is due to a demographic |

| 2 | change which of course has to do with the |
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| 3 | increased longevity of Americans, and the "Baby |
| 4 | Boomer Generation", reaching traditional |
| 5 | retirement age. As Americans live longer, and |
| 6 | many want to or need to stay in the labor market |
| 7 | beyond traditional retirement age. Sadly, many |
| 8 | more will have to stay, and especially if we go |
| 9 | over the fiscal cliff. Unemployment among New |
| 10 | Yorkers age 55, over 55, who wish to be in the |
| 11 | labor market is a significant challenge in the |
| 12 | city. People age 55 to 64 make up 15.1% of the |
| 13 | total labor force nationwide and make up 11.2% of |
| 14 | the total unemployment population nationwide. The |
| 15 | unemployment rate of people 55 to 64 is about |
| 16 | 5.9%. Although unemployment for this population |
| 17 | mirrors national trends, it is more troublesome |
| 18 | for older people due to the staggering duration of |
| 19 | unemployment. As of July, 2011 the average length |
| 20 | of time it takes for Americans 55 years old or |
| 21 | older to find employment is 52.7 weeks, compared |
| 22 | to 37.5 weeks for people under 55. Wow! The |
| 23 | resolution under discussion today would urge |
| 24 | businesses in the city to hire such workers in New |
| 25 | York over 55. I hope that my fellow Committee |

| members will support this resolution, and I'm sure |
|--|
| they certainly supported it. We were joined by |
| Council Members Nelson, Gennaro, Mark-Viverito, |
| and Ulrich. Finally, finally, my final thanks |
| now, let's see if I can do this without crippling |
| people's names. I'd like to thank my Committee |
| staff, Matthew Carlin, our counsel, and Faith |
| Corbett, our policy analyst. Again, it has been a |
| true privilege to be the Chair of this Committee, |
| to work with such diligent and fine people who |
| really want to make sure that New York has its |
| best and is at its best. If you've ever seen me |
| do something right, it has a lot to do with the |
| people who I've just named, and if I've stuttered |
| or stammered, it has a lot to do with I didn't |
| listen to them. Having said those things, I again |
| thank them very much, and I will proceed to join |
| the vote. |

COMMITTEE CLERK: Council Member Sanders.

CHAIRPERSON SANDERS, JR.:

Permission to explain my vote. Granted. As a person who is at that age or fast approaching it, I really think that this is something that New

| 2 | York should focus on. I do believe that people |
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| 3 | this age have something to contribute to the |
| 4 | wherewithal of New York, and we need to take that |
| 5 | into account. Having said that, I vote adamantly |
| 6 | yes. |

COMMITTEE CLERK: The final vote in the Committee on Civil Service & Labor in regards to Resolution 1352 is now six in the affirmative, zero in the negative and no abstentions.

CHAIRPERSON SANDERS, JR.: And since that vote has been made and the resolution will go forward, I sadly but passionately say that this meeting is now ... this hearing is now ended.
