2	CHAIRPERSON RIVERA: Thank you very				
3	much. Good morning, ladies and gentlemen. My				
4	name is Joe Rivera. I am the chair of the				
5	Committee on Rules, Privileges and Elections.				
6	Before we begin, let me introduce the members who				
7	are here with us today. We have Council Member Al				
8	Vann, Council Member Leroy Comrie, Council Member				
9	Karen Koslowitz, Council Member Inez Dickens,				
10	Council Member Vincent Gentile. We also have				
11	Council Member Lew Fidler, our minority leader				
12	Jimmy Oddo, Council Member Rosie Mendez, Council				
13	Member Gale Brewer is also here with us as well,				
14	and we are also joined by members of the staff.				
15	We have Chuck Davis. We also are joined by Nadia				
16	Joshua [phonetic), who will be standing in for				
17	today. We also have other members such as Jasmine				
18	Vega, Alicia Vassal [phonetic], Cora Marie Diegas				
19	[phonetic], John Clark and Diana Ariega				
20	[phonetic].				
21	Today we have before us one				
22	candidate for our review, Joseph A. Puma. Mr.				
23	Puma is a Manhattan resident, was recommended by				

the Manhattan delegation for designation by the

Council to the Civilian Complaint Review Board.

2	Upon	appointment	by	the	mayor,	Mr.	Puma	will	fill
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3 a vacancy and serve for the remainder of a three

4 year term that expires on July 4<sup>th</sup> of 2015.

5 Welcome, Mr. Puma. Will you please raise your

6 right hand to be sworn in?

MALE VOICE: Do you swear or affirm

8 to tell the truth?

JOSEPH A. PUMA: Yes, I do.

MALE VOICE: Thank you.

11 CHAIRPERSON RIVERA: Thank you very

12 much. Let me briefly describe the functions of

13 the Civilian Complaint Review Board. The Civilian

14 | Complaint Review Board is an independent body

charged with the duty to investigate complaints of

16 misconduct by police officers toward the public.

Board members are required to reflect the city's

18 diversity. The board consists of 13 members, 5

19 designated by the Council for appointment by the

20 mayor, 5 appointed by the mayor and three

21 designated by the police commissioner, which are

the only members who have law enforcement

23 experience. The Board has a civilian staff

responsible for conducting the investigations of

25 complaints received by the Board. The Board's

jurisdiction is limited to complaints complaining
excessive force, abuse of authority, discourtesy
or use of offensive language. The Board operates
in panels of at least three members. All CCRB
members are eligible for compensation on a per
diem basis. The current per diem rate is \$315.

Before we move on the Mr. Puma, let me call on

Council Member Rosie Mendez to make a brief

statement. Council Member?

Mr. Chair. Joseph Puma is a resident of my district, and he is also a friend. He came to work for my predecessor after I left, and I met him in that capacity, and then he served on the board of a not for profit organization doing housing and public housing organizing. It is through there where I really go to know Joseph, and I know him to be a very thoughtful, detailed, and very dedicated and committed human being committed to people and issues. I am proud that he has agreed to serve on the CCRB and I hope that everyone here affirms his appointment. Thank you very much, Mr. Chair.

4	JOSEPH A. PUMA: Yes, briefly.
5	CHAIRPERSON RIVERA: Perfect. Just
6	state your name for the record, and you may begin.
7	JOSEPH A. PUMA: Joseph A. Puma.
8	Good morning, Chair Rivera, members of the Rules,
9	Privileges and Elections Committee and Council
10	Member Mendez and Council staff. My name is
11	Joseph Puma, and it is an honor to sit before you
12	as a candidate for service on the Civilian
13	Complaint Review Board. I consider this a unique
14	and important opportunity to serve the residents
15	of New York City. I approach this opportunity
16	after spending seven years of my early career
17	working in New York City government with just over
18	two years separating my departure from the
19	intergovernmental relations unit of the Mayor's

Office of Management and Budget and - - . I also 20 21 come from a civil rights advocacy and community 22 organizing background having worked at the NAACP legal defense and educational fund, and I 23 24 currently serve a community based organization, 25 Good Old Lower East Side, as a board member. I am

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a native New Yorker and 30 year resident of public housing on the Lower East Side of Manhattan. Currently I am a pursing a master of arts at Union Theological Seminary in Manhattan. I believe my combination of experiences and my temperament would enable me to be a fair and effective member of the CCRB helping it fulfill its charter mandated responsibilities. Let me add one more thing, I am well aware that this seat, which has been reserved for a resident of Manhattan, has been vacant for some time, so I consider it a great honor that my possible appointment would finally fill a longstanding gap on the Board. Although I did not personally know the previous occupant of this seat prior to his death and wasn't familiar with his work prior to my candidacy, it is my understanding that his service to the Board and city was celebrated by many. keep this contextual information in mind in light of my possible confirmation today. I wish to thank the Manhattan delegation, and specifically Council Member Mendez, for recommending me for service on the CCRB, and I thank this committee for its consideration.

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2 CHAIRPERSON RIVERA: Thank you very 3 much, Mr. Puma. At this point in time, we will

4 field questions from Committee members. We will

5 start with Council Member Gale Brewer.

COUNCIL MEMBER BREWER: Thank you, Mr. Chair. I co-chair the Manhattan delegation, and I want to thank Council Member Mendez for recommending you. We have had a long journey--the like of which I don't think any other delegation has gone through in terms of finding the right candidate. Many of knew and loved Dennis deLeon, and he was an extraordinary leader in many ways and certainly gave us a lot of information and was a great CCRB representative, and I know that you will be the same. I think it's very indicative of how great you will be given the fact that you have been going to some of the meetings, and you have been able to show us your commitment. The CCRB is extremely important. I think you know that. know I've got or three cases pending before it, and I think the whole Manhattan delegation feels some challenges that we have waited this long because every person at the CCRB carries some weight in terms of dealing with the backlog, so I

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2	know in your material that you provided, you
3	indicated the importance of dealing with that
4	backlog, and I think your personality and your

5 knowledge of both the city and civil rights issue will bode us well. There is always a silver 6

lining--or mostly a silver lining to all 8 challenges, and you are our silver lining. 9 you very much.

JOSEPH A. PUMA: Thank you, Council Member.

CHAIRPERSON RIVERA: Thank you very much, Council Member. Are there any other committee members that want to ask a question or make a statement? Seeing none, thank you very much, Mr. Puma. At this point in time, we are going to open it up to the public. We have one member who wants to testify. Sir, if you can rejoin the audience, Mr. Puma, and then we will call you back in a minute. Just give me a second there, sir. No, Mr. Puma, you can... Okay. Perfect. We have with us Mr. Charles Mauler [phonetic], who is going to make a statement.
