Welcome to the people who have been sitting here for a long, long time. Today, we're discussing and voting on the Preconsidered Resolution recognizing June as Gun Violence Awareness Month. We've been joined by Council Members Foster, Greenfield, Ulrich, Garodnick, some others are on their way.

And as we know, the issue of gun violence has garnered national attention in the past few months due to the tragic events that have unfolded in Tucson, AZ; Aurora, CO; Newton, CT.

While it's heartening to see these events have sparked public outrage, it is important that the general public be aware that gun violence does not only take place in large-scale, highly publicized events. In reality, gun violence affects New Yorkers on a daily basis. For example, in 2012, there were nearly 1,375 shooting incidents where a person was either fatally or non-fatally injured in New York City. Additionally, 57% of all murders in our city in 2012 were attributed to gun violence.

While crime has been declining across much of the city, gun violence continues to plague many communities. This, unfortunately, is something that is especially true during the summer months of July and August.

For that reason, today we're here to vote on a resolution that would recognize the month of June as Gun Violence Awareness Month.

Together with similar resolutions being passed in the assembly and senate and in many other counties across the state, we can make sure that the public remains aware of this very real problem. With awareness will hopefully come constructive discussions to help identify the root causes of gun violence and the common sense steps we could take to stop it.

Again, thanks, everybody, for joining us. Not turning the floor over to anyone, there'll be no testimony, so we'll just call the vote.
