| CHAIRPERSON VACCA: [OII mic] Hello                          |

| everyone. Good afternoon. It is 1:15 p.m. on                |
| June $11^{\mathrm{th}}$ and I'm calling this meeting of the |
| Transportation Committee of the New York City               |
| Council to order. And I'd like to welcome the               |
| members who have joined us today, Council Member            |
| Gale Brewer, Council Member Oliver Koppell, Dan             |
| Garodnick, Ydanis Rodriguez, Vincent Ignizio,               |
| Debbie Rose, Peter Koo, and myself, James Vacca,            |
| Chari of the Committee and Darlene Mealy is here.           |
| We welcome everyone. Today we're going to vote on           |
| Intro 1042-A, a bill that will ensure that New              |
| York City drivers get what they pay for when they           |
| park at a muni-meter. I want to thank Council               |
| Member Greenfield for introducing this common               |
| sense piece of legislation and I also want to               |
| thank the Department of Transportation for working          |
| on it with us. As I noted in my opening at the              |
| hearing, the City's muni-meters are not perfect             |
| machines and they need to be calibrated. Muni-              |
| meters print receipts for customers once they pay           |
| for parking but these machines often run out of             |
| paper. We've heard countless stories of drivers             |
| feeding the muni-meters only to discover that the           |

| machine cannot print their receipt. The drivers    |
|--|
| are then forced to pay again at another muni-      |
| meter. Also, muni-meters will accept money during  |
| the hours when drivers are not required to pay for |
| these spaces. When parking is up to \$3.00 per     |
| hour, New Yorkers cannot afford to feed meters     |
| when it is unnecessary or when they cannot provide |
| proof that they paid. Intro 1042-A combats both    |
| of these issues. The bill will ensure that         |
| drivers are getting what they pay for and that     |
| they don't pay for what they're not getting. This  |
| legislation calls on the Department of             |
| Transportation to reprogram muni meters to not     |
| accept money when the meter cannot print receipts  |
| and during the hours when parking meter rules are  |
| not in effect. At our previous hearing DOT was     |
| amenable to these adjustments. With that said, do  |
| any of my colleagues wish to be heard before we    |
| vote? Hearing none, I will introduce Council       |
| Member, I will mention that we have been joined by |
| Council Member Greenfield and Council Member Van   |
| Bramer and I will ask the clerk to call the roll,  |
| please. The Chair recommends an aye vote.          |
