4	I'm the Chair of the Zoning and Franchises				
5	Subcommittee of the Land Use Committee and we are				
6	here today to, today we will be voting on Land Use				
7	847, 848 and 849 which together make up the				
8	applications for Madison Square Garden. I am				
9	joined by the following Members of the				
10	Subcommittee who are here, Council Member Al Vann,				
11	Council Member Dan Garodnick, Council Member				
12	Jessica Lappin, Council Member Leroy Comrie,				
13	Council Member Vincent Ignizio, as well as some				
14	Members of the Land Use Committee who are here but				
15	for quorum purposes I wanted to mention the				
16	Subcommittee about you, Council Member Dickens is				
17	here as well. It's always good to see you.				
18	Anyway, last week the Subcommittee had a very				
19	lengthy hearing in which the MSG representatives				
20	along with the project proponents and opponents				
21	offered thoughtful testimony on the conditions of				
22	the Special Permits MSG is seeking, mainly with				
23	regard to the term of the arena permit and the				
24	type of signage to be permitted outside and the				
25	need for the revamp to station. I want to

sincerely thank everyone who participated in that hearing. While many spoke about the need for upgrades in New York's largest transportation hub I want to reiterate that Madison Square Garden is not responsible for the infrastructure and Madison Square Garden representatives station. have assured the Subcommittee that they have over the years been a cooperative partner with Amtrak, New Jersey Transit, the MTA and the Long Island Railroad with regard to examining new ways of improving the functionality of the station and seeing as s safe and attractive Penn Station and that they have committed to their continued cooperation with the railroads in the future. As it is in MSG's interest to have a safe and functional station we are confident MSG will do this. We do not, however, believe that the Council should be approving a special permit for the 15 years which then delegates tot eh Department of City Planning, excuse me, for 15 years which then delegates to the Department of City Planning the ability to extend it beyond our imposed timeframe. This was seen as a loophole and therefore we would recommend ads did the Speaker

that we reduce the permit period from 15 years to
10 years and remove the conditions imposed by the
City Planning Commission that would allow that
special permit term to be extended by the
Department of City Planning without City Council
approval. We also believe that there, that this
is an appropriate area for advertising,
specifically for advertising of the sponsors of
Madison Square Garden. We think such advertising
will enliven the blank face that exists on $8^{\rm th}$
Avenue and will not adversely affect the setting
for the Farley Post Office. We recommended that
we modify the Planning Commissions decision as
follows, number one, to allow Madison Square
Garden in to install signage on what they refer to
as the returns which on MSG's original application
faced north and south of the $8^{\rm th}$ Avenue wall of the
theater on the $8^{\text{th}}$ Avenue wall of the theater, two
that we only permit sponsor advertising for MSG
and three, that we allow MSG to install and
operate their signage without regard to when
Amtrak installs its additional station
identification signage on the MSG site. This was
an issue that was raised at the hearing so they

Having said that I understand that there was a negotiation process, this has been approved at 10 year and I will vote in favor of but I wanted to just make my opinion heard as far as those specific years that were part of the discussion from the hearing as heard last, two weeks ago or last week. Thank you, Mr. Chair, and I vote aye.
