CHAIRPERSON ARROYO: Good afternoon

everyone, my name is Maria Del Carmen Arroyo; I chair

the Committee on Health and today the Health

Committee will vote on a package of five bills

dealing with restaurant inspections.

I wanna thank my fellow sponsors of these bills and our Speaker, Christine Quinn, for her leadership and her commitment to making sure that we get through this process as quickly as possible.

My co-sponsors, Council Member Gentile,
Council Member Koo, Council Member Reyna and Council
Member Van Bramer and I introduced five bills and by
now we're all familiar with the letter grading system
introduced by the New York City Department of Health
and Mental Hygiene, DOHMH, to assist the public in
making decisions about where to dine, improve
restaurant compliance with health and sanitary
regulations and reduce foodborne illnesses
attributable to restaurants.

However, since the inception of the system it has been marred with inconsistencies across inspections, adversarial relationships with the Department and restaurants and unduly burdensome

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increases in fines across the City for all restaurants.

On September 23rd the Committee held a hearing on the five pieces of legislation and we will vote on them today to address some of the issues raised since the implementation of the system and the process that the Council undertook for over a year to try to get us to where we are today.

Under Council Member Gentile's legislation the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene would be required to develop an inspection code of conduct pamphlet that inspectors will distribute to all restaurant owners and operators prior to the beginning of an initial inspection.

Council Member Koo's bill would create an advisory board to ensure ongoing and systematic review of the restaurant inspection program.

Council Member Reyna's legislation would increase and improve the reporting of restaurant inspection data and Council Member Van Bramer's bill would give restaurant owners and operators the opportunity to request a consultative and ungraded inspection for educational purposes only.

And finally, the bill that I sponsored calls for the establishment of an ombuds office to receive and address comments, complaints and compliments, because there are many compliments associated with this process.

These reforms will provide much needed relief for restaurant owners across the City and will go a long way to ensuring our letter grading system is reasonable, fair and most importantly, predictable.

I wanna thank the staff, Dan Hafetz, to

my right, Krista Gopon [phonetic], who is in the background, as usual, and Krilly [phonetic] and Francisco, who are the staff assigned to the Committee. Other staff did an incredible amount of work associated with this legislation and I'm gonna massacre their names, so please forgive me for doing so; Shannon Manago [phonetic], Tim Matusuf [phonetic]... is he here... are they here? Take a bow, guys... David Seitzer [phonetic] and Jennifer Montalgo, [phonetic] all of whom worked tirelessly behind the scenes to get us to where we're at today; I'm very happy that we are here to vote on these bills; I think that our restaurant industry across the City
