Let's first start with the transparency resolution. This transparency resolution makes mostly technical corrections to the designations listed in the Fiscal 2014 Schedule C and designates new organizations.

For clarification purposes it is to be noted that organizations appearing in the resolution that have not yet completed the prequalification process conducted by the Mayor's office of Contract Services by the Council or other government agency are identified in the attached chart with an asterisk.

Additionally, as with the transparency resolutions Council Members will have to sign a disclosure form indicating whether or not a conflict exists with any of the groups on the attached list.

If any Council Member has a potential conflict of interest with any of the organizations listed, he or she may want to disclose the conflict at the time of their vote.

We also have an expense budget modification that is related to this transparency

resolution, as well as past transparency resolutions.
This modification is our first budget modification
relating to the Fiscal 2014 Expense Budget that we
adopted in June. This modification reallocates
appropriations that were reflected in the Fiscal Year
2014 adopted budget to fund City Council initiatives.
This modification only includes Council-related items
and does not include any items from the
Administration. Without this modification many
organizations would not get their funding. Items in
today's transparency resolution that require the
budget modification in order for their funding to
move forward are referenced in the chart with a
double asterisk.

Our next item is a Preconsidered

Resolution that would allow New York City to waive

certain State-imposed fees for pulling documents,

such as deeds or other property records from the

County Clerk's Office in support of applications for

Sandy-related Small Business Administration benefits.

On September 27th the Governor signed into law a bill that authorizes New York City to waive these fees and if the City chooses to do so, the Council must pass a resolution acting on such

2 authorization within 30 days of an enactment of the 3 State law.

These small business loans are required by law to be recorded in the same manner as the mortgage with the respective County Clerks or City Register where the real property is located. As such, the fees associated with the filing practice are imposed on the real property owner.

In an effort to provide some additional relief to the real property owner suffering from the devastation incurred from Hurricane Sandy, this resolution would exempt the real property owner from the State portion of the required filing fee as well as authorize the County Clerk to issue refunds to those real property owners that have already paid the such filing fee.

This Preconsidered Resolution is sponsored by Council Member Lew Fidler and I applaud the Council Member for sponsoring this legislation; who hasn't joined us yet.

Now let's move onto our last item. Today we will vote on Intro 0598, which is a local law that would establish a business improvement district in SoHo, which is located in the district of Council

2 Member Margaret Chin who supports the establishment 3 of this BID.

The total first year budget of this BID is \$550,000 which will go to sanitation, snow removal, public safety services and general administration services.

Please review the BID's Committee Report and the attached district plan for details on the management, structure and district profile of the SoHo BID, along with the services provided by and property located within the BID.

If you remember, although not required by law, on November 20th, 2012 this Committee held an Oversight hearing on the SoHo BID before considering the legislation to create the BID. This Committee believed an Oversight hearing was necessary to allow the property owners and tenants in the BID boundaries an opportunity to be heard.

Following that hearing amendments were made to the BID's district plan and on March 13th this Committee held its first legislative hearing on Intro 0598. By law the Committee had to wait at least 30 days after its first public hearing on the

2 BID before it can again consider and possibly vote to 3 approve legislation to establish the BID.

The 30-day period immediately after the public hearing serves as an objection period, which gives a property owner affected by this BID a chance to formally object to its creation.

When considering Intro 0598, by law the Committee must answer the following four questions.

Were Notices of Hearings for all hearings required to be held published and mailed as so required? Does all the real property within the district's boundaries benefit from the establishment of the district except as otherwise provided by the law? 3. And all real property benefited by the district included within the district, and 4. Is the establishment of the district in the best interest of the public?

on these four questions and the number of objections required to prevent the creation of such district are not filed, then the legislation can be adopted. The objection period for the creation of this BID ended on April 11th at 5 p.m. According to the City Clerk, 2.7 percent or 7 of the 260 property owners located

in the proposed BID filed valid objections. Even
though a small percentage of people within the BID
boundaries objected to the creation of the SoHo BID
this Committee, along with Council Member Chin, who
was nothing short of patient, reasonable and
flexible, wanted to ensure that all affected
individuals were pleased with the creation of the
SoHo BID.

To that end, Council Member Chin entered into an MOU with a BID Steering Committee to require a 50 percent ratio between residential property owners and commercial property owners, a SoHo BID website, require at least two public informational sessions each year and require the BID Board to summarize and post all public comments, issues and concerns on the website of the SoHo BID DMA within 7 days.

Responses to such comments, issues and concerns shall be posted on the DMA website within 30 days. These provisions, along with many others in the MOU reflect Council Member Chin, the Finance Committee and SBS' commitment to the people of SoHo and the people of New York City.

Commissioner Andy Schwartz and Eddy Eng, Director at

the Neighborhood Development Division.

As required by the BID law, the SoHo BID
Steering Committee mailed the summary of the City
Council Resolution to each owner of real property
within the proposed district at the address shown on
the latest City Assessment Roll or to such other

persons as are registered with the City to receive tax bills concerning real property within the district and to the tenants of each building within the proposed district. In addition, the Department of Small Business Services arranged for the required publication of a copy of the summary of the resolution to the City record.

We are pleased to report on the result of the objections filed with the City Clerk against the establishment of the proposed SoHo Business
Improvement District. At the conclusion of the objection period at 5:00 on April 11th, 2013 and taking into consideration any objections postmarked by that date, seven valid objections were filed with the City Clerk. Owners of 7.4 percent of the assessed valuations of all benefited property situated within the district filed objections to the City district establishment. Also, 2.7 percent of the owners of benefited real property filed objections.

The total assessed valuation of real property within the district is \$525,512,183 and the total number of properties is 280, which are held by 260 property owners.
