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CHAIRPERSON WEPRIN: [speaking Spanish] [background comments, laughter] Alright. Alright. You ready? [background comments] Everyone ready? Good morning everyone. My name is Mark Weprin; I am the Chair of the Zoning and Franchises Subcommittee; I'd like to welcome you all here today. We are joined by the following members of the Subcommittee for quorum purposes, Council Member Joel Rivera, Council Member Diana Reyna, Council Member Leroy Comrie, Council Member Robert Jackson, Council Member Dan Garodnick, Council Member Jessica Lappin, and Council Vincent Ignizio... [background comments] Okay. And then we're also joined by members of the Land Use Committee, who are here visiting us and will be talked about later, but let's not waste time.

We are here today... we have two items on the agenda at the moment, one, which is a hearing we had yesterday on Rangold [phonetic] which is 951, 952 and 953 -- that will be laid over for a future meeting -- the hearing we had yesterday. And the other item that is on today's agenda is Land Use No.

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945 and 946 known as the East Midtown Rezoning. Now
that... we will have a Motion to File pursuant to a
Letter of Withdrawal on that item by the applicant,
the New York City Department of City Planning, for
those two items, so we will not be hearing those
items today. We'd like to call on Council Member
Dan Garodnick, who represents the majority of this
rezoning, to give a statement on this matter. So
Council Member Garodnick.

COUNCIL MEMBER GARODNICK: Thank you, Mr. Chairman. And first of all, let me thank you in particular for chairing what was a very extensive hearing on the subject of East Midtown Manhattan and a lot of ideas were unearthed during that hearing and certainly it was important for this Council's ability to get clarity on the subject. I also wanna recognize the work of Mayor Bloomberg and Deputy Mayor Steel and City Planning Chair, Amanda Burden and their teams which propelled the idea of rezoning Grand Central and its area forward. We are very fortunate that they took the initiative here to begin that important process.

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2 But unfortunately, a good idea alone is 3 not enough always for us to justify action; we 4 certainly should be rezoning East Midtown, but only when we can do so in a complete fashion and as many 5 of you know, we were unable to reach agreement on a 6 7 number of issues in the proposed plan; among those 8 issues, we remain concerned with the price 9 methodology and timing of the air rights that were 10 anticipated to be sold by the City for the District 11 Improvement Bonus; we are concerned with the certainty and funding level of the infrastructure 12 improvements, which include both the above- and 13 14 below-grade needs; the public realm plan, which we 15 worked very hard to secure, is important, but it is 16 also aspirational and it is unclear at this point 17 whether some of its most visionary improvements can

So this is a proposal which deserves more attention and more work; I am pleased that we do not have to cast a no vote today; in fact, I think that this should be the beginning of a larger conversation, and I think that we can achieve all of the goals that are set out by the Bloomberg Administration and do so in a way that respects the

That said, this has been a process that has moved very quickly and on somewhat of an artificial timeframe from the beginning and I have been really heartened to see the work of the triboard task force because truthfully, in my 15 years in government I'm not sure I have ever seen this kind of comprehensive civic engagement across neighborhoods, across community boards in a very thoughtful, professional, collaborative and instructive manner, and I hope that that is a model, regardless of what applications come before the Council in the future that can be replicated, because I think it was very powerful and very productive.

another iteration of this, because, you know at least one of the developers who came and testified is gonna be building no matter what; another said that they will not move forward and we will see what they decide ultimately. But there is going to be some development that happens in this area and as much as we can benefit as a city from that, I think we should. And there's some development that should

With that in mind, I want to acknowledge that we have been joined by Council Member Wills, Ruben Wills from Queens and we will now have a motion to vote on; I will make a Motion to File pursuant to a Letter of Withdrawal by the applicant, again, the New York City Department of City Planning; there'll be an aye vote, which means we approve the withdrawal and so this is on Land Use Items 945 and 946, the East Midtown Rezoning. I'd like to call on Ann McCoy, the Counsel, to please call the roll.
