Resolution. This resolution sets forth new changes
in the designation of certain organizations receiving
local into a new discretionary funding, as well as
new changes in the designation of certain
organizations receiving funding pursuant to certain
initiatives in the budget. Organizations appearing in
the resolutions that have not yet completed the prequalification process conducted by the Mayor's Office
of Contract Services, the Council, and any other
entity are identified in the attached charts with an
asterisk.

As with all transparency resolutions, council members will have to sign a disclosure form indicating whether or not a conflict exists with any of the groups in the attached list. If any council member has a potential conflict of interest with any of the organizations listed, he or she has the opportunity to disclose the conflict at the time of the vote. As a reminder, please disclose any conflicts you have with proposed subcontracts that are used by organizations sponsored by discretionary funding. These disclosures must be made before the subcontract can be approved.
