4	Dromm, and I'm Chair of the Education Committee of							
5	the City Council. We're here this morning to vote on							
6	Intro No. 12-A. The prime sponsor is Council Member							
7	Andy King, and this introduction would amend the							
8	Administrative Code of the City of New York in							
9	relationship with requiring the Department of							
LO	Education to report academic and demographic							
ll	information on co-located schools. This is a piece							
L2	of legislation of which I am supportive, and I hope							
L3	that other members of the committee will also vote in							
L4	favor. The issue of co-located schools is one of							
L5	major importance to me as the Chair of this							
L6	committee. I am very appreciative of Council Member							
L7	King's efforts to get us the information that is							
L8	necessary to do a thorough analysis of what the							
L9	impact of co-located schools is on the community on							
20	the students, on students' success rates. All of							
21	this information will be important for us to evaluate							
22	what it means when a school is co-located into an							
23	existing school. So with that, I'm going to turn							
24	this over to Council Member King to say a few words,							

25 and then we will call the vote. Council Member King.

2	COUNCIL MEMBER KING: Thank Mr. Chair,								
3	and I appreciate your leadership in helping us move								
4	forth this vote today. Just quick and simple. This								
5	piece of legislation will allow us to analyze the co-								
6	location of many schools throughout the buildings								
7	that are on city property, and it also allows us to								
8	get back on track of how we identify an education								
9	system that's fair and equal for all New York								
10	children. So I'm grateful to everyone today, and I'm								
11	asking everyone and urging everyone to support this								
12	piece of legislation, Intro 12 because I think it's								
13	just the right thing for us to do. I thank you.
