CHAIRPERSON CUMBO: Good morning. you all for coming today. I am Laurie Cumbo, chair of the Committee on Women's Issues. Todav is a continuation of the hearing on Resolution Number 354, which calls upon the United States to pass and the President to sign companion legislation to H.R. 863, which would establish a commission to study the creation of a National Women's History Museum. As I mentioned in my original opening statement, women, who comprise about 51 percent of our nation's population are sorely represented in United States history books. In response to this lack of inclusion of women's history, Congress Member Carolyn Maloney introduced H.R. 863 legislation, which would establish a congressional commission to study the potential creation of a National Women's History Museum in Washington, D.C., which was passed by the House of Representatives in May 2014 with bipartisan support and was sent to the Senate for consideration.

I'd like to recognize Elizabeth Crowley, I'd like to recognize Karen Koslowitz and my co-chair here today; I'm very happy to have Ben Kallos, who introduced this resolution. Ben, if you could say something briefly about this, and then we will bring it to a vote.
