19 Call-Ups were adopted by a vote of 44 in the
20 affirmative, 0 in the negative-- Quiet in the
21 Chambers, Please. May we have seats in the balcony,
22 quite in the Chambers. Now, communication from
23 Speaker Melissa Mark-Viverito.

24 SPEAKER MARK-VIVERITO: Thank you, Madam
25 Public Advocate, and first and foremost, I would like

2 to tell, you know, wish everyone a happy new year,
3 Feliz Ano Nuevo, as we enter into 2015, and this
4 being our first meeting of the year. So, I want to
5 begin today by acknowledging Officers Andrew Dossi
6 and Aliro Pellerano, who were wounded in the line of
7 duty late Monday night in the Bronx, in Council
8 Member Ritchie Torres' district. I know I speak for
9 the entire Council in wishing them a quick and
10 complete recovery. And it's good to hear that they
11 are on their way.

12 Violence against our police officers is a
13 horrible and deplorable crime. It is an assault
14 against all New Yorkers, and those who are
15 responsible should be prosecuted to the fullest
16 extent of the law. Everyday New York's police
17 officers risk their lives keeping New Yorkers safe,
18 and we're very grateful for their service, dedication
19 and commitment. I would also like to ask my
20 colleagues to stand.

21 SERGEANT-AT-ARMS: All rise.

22 PUBLIC ADVOCATE JAMES: Please rise.

23 Everyone in the balcony please rise.

24 SPEAKER MARK-VIVERITO: As we pay our
25 respects to Detective Ramos and Detective Liu, the

2 two NYPD officers who were assassinated last month in
3 a tragic and horrific act of senseless violence. And
4 we all know it has been a difficult several weeks
5 since that occurred. Additionally, I want to join in
6 remembering Governor Mario Cuomo who passed on
7 Thursday, January 1st. Mario Cuomo was a remarkable
8 man, a trailblazer, and an inspiration for all New
9 Yorkers. Our deepest condolences go out to the Cuomo
10 family, and to Governor Cuomo whose eulogy was
11 extremely moving and touching. So on behalf of Mario
12 Cuomo, Detective Liu and Detective Ramos, I ask my
13 colleagues to join me in a moment of silence.

14 [a moment of silence was observed]

15 SPEAKER MARK-VIVERITO: Thank you, my
16 colleagues. Today, we're voting on two budget
17 modifications to invest additional funds to keep
18 programs that provide vital services to New Yorkers.
19 For example, we're allocating \$2.5 million to help
20 implement President Obama's Executive Order on
21 Immigration, and \$4.9 million to the Human Resources
22 Administration Homeless Prevention efforts. As you
23 all remember, back in June we fought for every dollar
24 of funding to important initiatives across the city.
25 But the fight to make sure that every New Yorker gets

2 important services extends beyond budget negotiations
3 in June. Today, thanks to the advocacy of this
4 Council and the leadership of our Finance Chair
5 Julissa Ferreras we're able to allocate additional
6 funds to so many deserving programs. And this is
7 something that we should recognize because it's
8 something that has really been seen before. And
9 obviously, there always is room for improvement, but
10 this is something that we as a City Council should be
11 extremely proud of.

12 But, it's not just council members who
13 put in hard work around here. That extends to the
14 staff as well, and we thank them deeply for the hard
15 work they engage in each and every day. But, today
16 we're getting ready to send off a very special member
17 of our staff. As some of you, many of you already
18 know, Jeff Rodus will be leaving us this Friday.
19 [groans] Jeff [laughs]--Jeff has served in our
20 Capital Budget Unit and Finance Division now as
21 Deputy Chief of Staff for 24 years. [applause,
22 cheers, whistles] All right, Jeff. Yay, Jeff. If
23 we--if we don't stop, I think he's going to start
24 crying. [laughter] You know, Jeff has told me that
25 basically his whole--almost his whole professional

2 career has been here at the Council. And we are
3 deeply, deeply indebted to him for that. Under four
4 different Speakers, Jeff has worked at the highest
5 level with administration and agency officials to
6 ensure that the Council's budget and oversight roles
7 have a positive impact on the City of New York. We
8 are all going to miss Jeff greatly. I know for me
9 personally as Speaker now for a year, your friendship
10 and partnership has been tremendous, Jeff. Obviously,
11 we're going to miss Jeff's quirky humor, his
12 unparalleled knowledge, and his tremendous
13 leadership. So we definitely want to wish him the
14 best of luck in the next phase of his professional
15 career. We're very proud of you, me personally,
16 Jeff. Thank you very much, and I know there is going
17 to be a great party later on for you so--

18 I would also like to finish by noting
19 that tomorrow January 8th marks one year since we
20 came together in this Chamber and began our current
21 session under a new City Council. It's been an honor
22 and a privilege to serve as Speaker this past year,
23 and I'm very proud of the way we've come together as
24 a body to do great things for this city. From
25 expanding paid sick leave to creating a Municipal ID

2 program for all New Yorkers to improving traffic and
3 pedestrian safety in our city, this Council has risen
4 to find solutions that improve the lives of our
5 residents, and make New York stronger, safer and more
6 inclusive. In this first year, we changed the budget
7 process engaging City Council Members and the
8 Administration in a new way. Identifying shared
9 priorities and ensuring that needed resources go to
10 all districts in a more equitable way. So I want to
11 thank everyone for their support. I look forward to
12 all the work and achievements that lie ahead in 2015
13 and the years to come. And with that, I conclude my
14 remarks, Madam Public Advocate.

15 PUBLIC ADVOCATE JAMES: Discussion of--

16 SPEAKER MARK-VIVERITO: [interposing]

17 Oh, I'm sorry. I'm sorry. No, no, give me a second.
18 I apologize. Guys, we are trying to work diligently
19 here, and now my--the password. Sorry. We're
20 working diligently to get Jeff a Proclamation, which
21 unfortunately is not ready at this moment, but I will
22 be getting it later. But I want to read some of the
23 language of what--some of it. You know, some of the
24 things we have to do. It's still good until the
25 delays. So I just wanted to read a couple of the

2 whereas here that we have for Jeff that the City of
3 the-- Oh, thank you. This is helpful. Yes.

4 That the Council of the City of New York
5 is proud to honor Jeff Rodus for his stellar service
6 to the Council and to the people of the City of New
7 York. It's going to say Jeffrey Rodus on his
8 proclamation, but-- [laughter]. Jeff Rodus has more
9 than 23 years of experience in the New York City
10 Council starting as a Finance Analyst in 1991 and
11 rising to the level of Deputy Chief of Staff this
12 past year. He has long partnered with all of the
13 City's cultural institutions and libraries securing
14 major budget restorations and capital funding. As a
15 key budge negotiator for the City's \$77 billion
16 budget, Jeff worked closely and tirelessly with the
17 Council to ensure that the budget reflects the
18 priorities of the Council and the people of the City
19 of New York.

20 He negotiated the first memorandum of
21 understanding governing the development and amendment
22 of the Department of Education's Five-Year Capital
23 Plan, establishing protocols for including council
24 members in planning, development, and overseeing the
25 annual \$100 million plus portfolio of member funded

2 school projects. He was instrumental in integrating
3 the Council's Capital Budget Unit into the Finance
4 Division when he served as First Deputy Director for
5 several years. He's also been an Adjunct Professor
6 at Baruch College where he developed a curriculum for
7 and taught a master's level course in budgeting,
8 accounting, and financial analysis. He has been
9 recognized with a Distinguished Alumni Award from
10 Baruch College. That's my alma mater, and
11 Metropolitan Council on Jewish Poverty Chesed Award.
12 He has built a strong and lasting leadership--I'm
13 sorry--relationship with people from all walks of
14 life across New York City, and is universally known
15 for his great sense of humor and warm personality.

16 So that--let it be know that the Council
17 of the City of New York gratefully honors Jeffrey
18 Rodus for his stellar service to the Council and to
19 the people of the City of New York, and we signed it
20 today. Congratulations, sir. [cheers and applause]

15 protecting the community from violence and harm.
16 Detective Liu and Detective Ramos killed in the line
17 of duty. Heroes. Less than 40 hours ago Police
18 Officer Andrew Dossi and Police Officer Aliro
19 Pollanaro--Pellerano were shot in the line of duty
20 while risking their lives to stop a robbery in
21 progress. Heroes. Our City is grateful for the men
22 and women of the NYPD who proudly protect our
23 communities and keep us safe. The bravery our police
24 officers show every day is second to none. This past
25 Sunday when I was at the funeral for Detective Liu, I
