CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Good morning ladies and gentlemen. I am Council Member I. Daneek Miller, Chair of the Committee on Civil Service and Labor.

Today we are voting on four resolutions, all related in some way to workers' issues.

We held a hearing on Monday within we heard these resolutions, in addition, two bills and another resolution from Women's Issues Committee.

Today the Committee will send a message to the legislators of the State of New York that the City of New York needs to be able to set a higher minimum wage and enforce state labor laws locally, and New York needs a stronger Wage Theft Protection Act and Paid Family Leave Act. This Tuesday we expect the Full Body of the Council to endorse this concept as well.

The first resolution we'll be hearing today is Res No. 610, which is sponsored by Speaker Mark-Viverito and numerous members of the Council, including Daniel Dromm, Ben Kallos and myself. This resolution calls upon New York State legislators to pass and the Governor to sign legislation granting New York City the authority to set its own minimum

COMMITTEE ON CIVIL SERVICE AND LABOR 4 wage. I am proud to say that we adopted a similar bill last year.

The second resolution is No. 611, sponsored by the Speaker and other members of this committee. This resolution calls upon New York State Legislators to pass and the Governor to sign and grant the City the authority to enforce State Worker Protection Laws.

The third resolution, No. 612, sponsored by Speaker Mark-Viverito; also members of this committee and Torres, Lancman, Ferreras; Johnson; this reso calls upon New York State legislators to pass and the Governor to sign Assembly Bill 5501, strengthening the provisions of Wage Theft Prevention Act.

The final Resolution, No. 615-A, sponsored by Council Member Lancman, the Speaker and others, including myself; this resolution calls upon the State of New York to pass and the Governor to sign Paid Family Leave Act to provide support and security for New York working families.

Now I would like acknowledge members of the Civil Service Committee, Costa Constantinides, Robert Cornegy, and Daniel Dromm. And I would also


