Re: <u>Thursday, April 30, 2015 New York City Council Committee on Governmental</u> <u>Operations Hearing - Intro 585</u>

Thank you for the opportunity to testify in relation to Intro 585, which would impose term limits on newly-appointed community board members.

I hereby submit that this Intro should be withdrawn, for the following reasons:

• The need for term limits has not been demonstrated; community board members already are subject to periodic non-reappointment, and to removal for cause.

• Many board members continue to grow in value to a board and its community beyond twelve years; loss or interruption of their services could hurt the community's voice in governmental decisions.

• Term limits could influence why some people join community boards, increasing the incentive for them to view board membership as a career credential. This might influence how they vote on matters before the board, including those affecting the board's own welfare.

• Term limits could subtly shift the relationship between the volunteer members of a board and its district manager, who is not term-limited.

- Term limits would hurt a community board's institutional memory.
- Term limits would reduce the pool of candidates for board membership.

• Term limits would infringe on the prerogatives of future borough presidents and constrain their authority.

• An argument for consistency with the existence of term limits for elected City officials fails to acknowledge that community boards are advisory and that their members are unpaid volunteers.
