2	CHAIR TREYGER: Ok, good afternoon, I'm
3	Council Member Mark Treyger, Chair of the Committee
4	of Recovery and Resiliency and we are convened today
5	for a second hearing and vote on resolution 909,
6	sponsored Council Member Margaret Chin. This
7	resolution calls on the United States to Department
8	of Housing and Urban Development to support New York
9	City Application for National Disaster Resilience
10	Competition Funding. As we have heard in recent
11	hearings, the City's current coastal defense plans
12	will cost billions of dollars to implement Citywide
13	and we are currently only half funded. We will need
14	funding from outside the City if we are to meet our
15	goals. The City has submitted an application to the
16	National Disaster Resilience Competition seeking an
17	award of up to \$500 million to build costal defenses
18	and strong water management info-structure in lower
19	Manhattan and the two bridges area. Director Dan
20	Zaru (sp) in his Office of Recovery and Resiliency
21	has spent a great deal of time preparing an
22	application and conducting outreach to the public in
23	lower Manhattan to improve it and I want to thank
24	them for that. But no matter how carefully we plan
25	without sufficient funding none of our resiliency

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2	plans will be possible. Therefore, it is
3	tremendously important that we show our support for
4	this application and I also just wanted to be mindful
5	to say that our resiliency planning has to be a part
6	of a larger network and larger system that has to of
7	course protect lower Manhattan but it also has to
8	extend to Staten Island, to Queens, the Rockaways, to
9	Southern Brooklyn in my district and parts of the
10	Bronx as well. We need a 5 Borough resiliency plan.
11	I am proud to say that I am a co-sponsor of this
12	resolution and want to thank Council Member Margaret
13	Chin for her leadership as well as the Borough
14	President in Manhattan, Gail Brewer as well and their
15	tireless efforts to rebuild and protect their
16	communities in lower Manhattan. I also want to thank
17	my fellow Committee Members for their support of of
18	this resolution and all their work on this Committee.
19	I'd like to thank our legislative staff, Lora Poppa
20	(sp), Matt Goleib, Jeff Baker and Ed Adkins and our
21	Committee staff Policy Analyst Bill Murray, Finance
22	Analyst, Jonathan Seltzer (sp) and Committee Counsel,
23	Brad Reed and my Chief of Staff Ethan Lustig-Elgrably
24	for all of their efforts. Maybe the Council Member

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would like to say a few words before we... we hold the vote but, sure.
