CHAIRPERSON VACCA: Joe Borelli, how are you? You're on time. Okay, thank you everyone. Good afternoon. My name is James Vacca, and I'm Chair of the Committee on Technology, and today we're here to vote on two pieces of legislation in relation to the accessibility of our city's websites to persons with disabilities, and to those who are limited English proficient. My colleagues are here with me today, Council Member Joseph Borelli, Council Member Barry Grodenchik, and we're also joined by Council Member Jumaane Williams sponsors of one-sponsor of one of the bills, 673-A, which would require every city agency website to provide a translation feature. I also want to thank Council Member Garodnick for introducing legislation dealing with those with disabilities. Since this committee's hearing on both of these bills was completed last spring, we worked with the Administration to tighten up language, and it's been encouraging to see the commitment that everyone across the board has had to making these bills a reality. I want to thank the Speaker, of course, and let me first call upon Council Member Williams, sponsor of Intro 673-A.

COUNCIL MEMBER WILLIAMS: Thank you, Mr.
Chair and thank you for your support and leadership
on this, and obviously we want to thank the Speaker
as well and thank you the Administration for working
with us to tighten the language, and making something
that they can agree with. To me it's kind of a no-
brainer. There's already laws that require things to
be translated in specific languages. It makes sense
that our website should adhere to that law as well.
I think as people are going to get information, they
should try to get it in a language they understand so
they can fully understand how our city operates.
This just seemed to be a common sense button that is
going to rotate. So we have at least seven major
languages. So people can see theirs and just
translate it. It seemed like a simple solution that
will help a lot of people. So thank you so much for
having this hearing, and this vote today.
