3	and welcome to today's Finance Committee Hearing.
4	I'm Council Member Julissa Ferreras-Copeland, I'm the
5	Chair of the Committee. We've been joined by Counci.
6	Members Cornegy, Rodriguez, Matteo, Rosenthal, Van
7	Bramer, Levine and Gibson. Today we have one item or
8	the agenda. Proposed Intro. 806B, which I've
9	sponsored in conjunction with the Mayor which would
10	authorize the Department of Finance to establish a
11	temporary amnesty program to resolve certain
12	outstanding environmental control board judgement.
13	ECB is an administrative (inaudible)at adjudicate
14	hearings on notices of violations issued by the
15	City's enforcement agencies for various quality of
16	life fractions such as sanitation code or building
17	code violations. ECB does not issue notices of
18	violations itself nor does it direct control or
19	otherwise where, when and to whom the notices are
20	issued. Once an agency writes a quality of life
21	ticket, it is referred to ECB for adjudication. If
22	after a hearing ECB finds that the respondent was in
23	violations, then it will impose penalties. If the
24	respondent is not paid a fine or appear before ECB
25	when they are in default and ECB will impose the

default penalties. Outstanding ECB judgements debt results when either the penalty or default penalty is not paid in ECB docket the judgement in court and refers the case to the DOF for collection. Last year in an effort to bring more transparency in the ECB debt collection process. The Council passed local law 11 that requires and annual report from DOF to the Council detailing the amount of outstanding ECB judgements at DOF. The enforcement toll used by DOF and the success of DOF collection efforts. The first such report was issued in November 2015 and it revealed that there was \$1.6 billion in outstanding ECB judgement debt. Up \$91,000,000 from June 14<sup>th</sup> of that amount \$386,000,000 was interest, \$709,000,000 was penalties and approximately 75% of the total debt owed was more than 2 ½ years old. In addition \$200,000,000 of the outstanding debt was from judgements docketed in fiscal 2015 and DOF reported that it had collected \$17.7 million dollars or 8.8% of that fiscal 2015 debt. In order to encourage more people to resolve their outstanding ECB debt, I am sponsoring proposed intro. 806B, which would create a 90 day temporary amnesty program to be offered during fiscal 17'. Respondents who have default judgements

would be able to resolve their debt by paying the 2 3 base penalty and having the default penalties and 4 accrued interest waved. Respondents who had judgements against them as a result of being found in violation after an ECB hearing would be able to 6 7 resolve the debt by paying 70% of the imposed penalty 8 and having the accrued interest waived. administered a similar program in 2009 that did not have a very high participation rate. To increase the 10 11 participation rate in this amnesty program the legislation includes a provision that eligible 12 13 respondents would default judgements who do not 14 participate in the amnesty program would be offered a 15 less generous settlement should they try to resolve 16 the debt with DOF after the program has ended. 17 legislation also requires DOF to conduct a media 18 campaign to advertise the amnesty program. 19 to thank the staff of the Finance Division; Tanesha 20 Edwards, Chief Counsel and Rebecca Chasen, Assistant 21 Counsel for working on this bill for over a year and ensuring that it was drafted in way that gives the 2.2 2.3 City a strong tool to collect some of the \$1.6 billion it's owed, also provides an opportunity for 24 people with outstanding ECB judgements against them 25
