At the first hearing on Int. 436, the business community expressed support for fine reduction efforts. The retail food industry also argued that the wide use of computerized checkout technology and price scanners have overtaken the need for individual sticker prices on each item offered for sale at a grocery store. However, DCA testified that item pricing remains an important protection for consumers, particularly seniors, those with limited English proficiency and low-income communities. Originally, Int. 436 would have allowed DCA to issue a warning instead of a violation if less than five stock-keeping units failed to comply with the City's item pricing laws. However, at the previous hearing on this bill DCA recommended curable violations for first-time violators. The agency noted that such

violations will still be considered first violations

3 and subsequent violations will be treated as

4 recidivist, subject to penalty and incentive

5 compliance.

Additionally, DCA testified that the agency keeps manually of warnings issued, inspectors use handheld devices that do not provide on-the-spot information regarding previous warnings. Based on DCA's feedback and the inability of inspectors to keep track of warnings, Int. 436-A was amended. Proposed Int. 436-A, as now amended, allows retail stores to cure a first-time violation by submitting satisfactory evidence within 30 days that corrective action has been taken to cure the violation and the cured retailer would not have to pay the fine.

Proposed Int. 436-A will preserve pricing transparency for consumers and treat merchants acting in good faith with fairness. I recommend a yes vote from my colleagues. Mr. Clerk, please call the roll, but before we do that, do any of my colleagues have anything to say on the bill?
