CHAIRPERSON GIBSON: Good morning, ladies and gentlemen, good morning colleagues. I am Council Member Vanessa Gibson of the Sixteenth District in the Bronx, and I'm proud to Chair the Committee on Public Safety. This morning we will be voting on Proposed Intro 1000-B, which is legislation that will require the NYPD to report on seized property data on an annual basis, and to remove an existing requirement concerning reporting on the disposition of certain unclaimed property. I'd like to thank the sponsor of this bill Council Member Ritchie Torres for sponsoring this important piece of legislation. I'd also like to thank the members of the Public Safety Committee who are here, our Minority Leader Council Member Steve Matteo, our Council Member James Vacca, Council Member Vincent Gentile, Council Member Chaim Deutsch, and Council Member Rory Lancman. a person is arrested, their money, their vehicle or other personal property must be dealt with, and so the Police Department has promulgated rules to establish certain procedures to be followed with respect to the custody and the disposition of

property by the NYPD. This legislation will provide transparency regarding the seizure, the vouchering, the classification, and the return of the property by requiring an annual report detailing such data for the preceding calendar year disaggregated by borough and policy precinct. The circumstances of an arrest may be complicated or sometimes chaotic, and dealing with one's personal property often adds to this confusion. Depending on a variety of factors, property may be held or kept by the department after an arrest, and without full transparency surrounding this process, individuals may be left feeling they have been robbed of their property, and denied due As more light is shed on the processes surrounding arrest property across—across the country, many local and state legislatures are considering changes to make the process more user friendly such as creating tracking systems for seized property and other measures that promoted transparency. Strengthening the relationship between the community and the Police Department continues to be one of our top priorities, and this legislation will work to advance that goal by providing additional oversight and transparency into the
