CHAIRPERSON GIBSON: Good afternoon, ladies and gentlemen. Good afternoon colleagues. Welcome to the Public Safety Committee and our vote today. I'm Council Member Vanessa Gibson of the 16th District. I'm proud to serve as chair of the Committee on Public Safety and I'd like to thank all of my colleagues for being here this morning, this afternoon. We will be voting on Proposed Intro 1611-A, which is a bill that relates require the Police Department to submit reports on clearance rates of index crimes as well as Proposed Intro 1664-A, which relates to requiring the Police Department to report on the number of arrests and summons that are returnable to the Transit Adjudication Bureau for subway fare evasion. I would like to thank the sponsors of today's bills, Council Member Rory Lancman and Council Member Ritchie Torres, and certainly I'd like to thank the staff on the Public Safety Committee for all of our their work, our Senior Legislative Counsel Deepa Ambekar, our Legislative Policy Analyst Casey Addison, and our Financial Analyst Steve Riester. Propose Intro 1611-

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A, which is sponsored by Council Member Torres relates to requiring the Police Department to submit reports on its clearance rates. The bill would require the NYPD to report on a quarterly basis the number of index crimes by borough where at least one person has been arrested and charged with the commission of the offense.

Proposed Intro 1664-A, sponsored by Council Member Lancman relates to reporting on fare evasion arrests or also known as jumping the turnstile offenses. The NYPD can enforce this by issuing a civil summons that's returnable to the Transit Adjudication Bureau or under the State's Penal Law. This bill will require the NYPD to report how many tab summons are issued, and how many people are arrested under the Penal Law. The information would then be disaggregated by transit bureau, subway station and the demographics of the offender. addition, the bill would require the NYPD to public their policy with respect to determining whether an individual is issued a summons returning to the Transit Adjudication Bureau or a criminal summons. I'd like to thank both Council Members Torres and Council Member Lancman for sponsoring today's

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legislation that's on our agenda and certainly for all of my colleagues for being here today. through this legislation we will continue our efforts to providing the NYPD with the support that's needed, but truly making sure that the available tools to us can help us improve the overall public safety and create equity in the system. I encourage all of my colleagues today to vote in favor of these two items on the agenda, Intro 1611 and Intro 1664, and now I'd like to recognize the members of the committee who are here: Council Member Gentile, Council Member Cornegy, Council Member Deutsch, Council Member Lancman and Minority Leader Council Member Matteo. Do any of my colleagues have any questions or comments on the bills before we begin our vote? Hearing none, I will now ask our committee clerk William Martin to please call the roll. Thank you, colleagues.
