CHAIRPERSON FERRERAS-COPELAND: GOOD
morning and welcome to today's finance meeting, I
the final one of 2014 to 2017 session. My name is
Julissa Ferreras-Copeland and I am the Chair of this
Committee. We've been joined by Minority Leader
Matteo. Majority Leader Van Bramer, Council Members
Gibson, Cumbo, Cornegy and Johnson. Today we'll be
voting on two items, a transparency resolution and ar
LU item. Let's start with the transparency resolution
which sets forth the new designations and changes in
designations of certain organizations receiving local
and youth discretionary funding and funding pursuant
to certain initiatives in the budget. Organizations
appearing in the resolution that have not yet
completed the prequalification process conducted by
the Mayor's Office of Contract Services, the Council
or any other entity are identified in the attached
chart with an asterisk. As with all transparency
resolutions Council Members will have to sign a
disclosure form indicating whether or not a conflict
exists with any of the groups on the attached list.
If any Council Member has a potential conflict of
interest with any of the organizations listed he or

sne has the opportunity to disclose the conflict at
the time of their vote. As a reminder please disclose
any conflicts you may have with the proposed
subcontractors used by organizations sponsored by
discretionary funding. These disclosures must be made
before the subcontractor can be approved. Rohan Grant
from the General Council's Office is here and can
assist you with any questions or concerns regarding
the disclosures. We also will be voting on an LU
item, the Banana Kelly Project in Council Member
Salamanca's district in the Bronx, this property
would receive a full 40-year property tax exemption
to preserve 21 units of affordable housing under the
city's HDFC Program, Council Member Salamanca
supports this project. Before the roll is called I
would like to end on a personal note as this is a
bittersweet day for me. Today of course is the last
time I will Chair the Finance Committee, it has been
an extraordinary honor and privilege to serve as the
Council's Finance Chair these past four years. There
are many people for me to acknowledge and thank,
first and foremost thank you to our Speaker Melissa
Mark-Viverito for the trust placed in me to serve in
such a crucial role amongst my colleagues, your

legacy as a leader of this body is an exceptional
one. Both the city and the council are better off
because of the efforts you have made these past four
years. I must of course also thank the Speaker's
Chief of Staff, Ramon Martinez for his advocacy on
behalf of this institution and its members but also
for being a very direct and clear friend. To my
colleagues on the Finance Committee, Majority Leader
Jimmy Van Bramer, Minority Leader Steve Matteo,
Council Members Corey Johnson, Helen Rosenthal,
Daneek Miller, Laurie Cumbo, Mark Levine, Robert
Cornegy, Vanessa Gibson, and Ydanis Rodriguez I have
enjoyed working with each one of you and this
committee's success results from the work we have
done together. Aside from the hundreds of hours of
budget hearings we sat through together that helped
inform the passage of four budgets, we have passed 51
bills on a wide range of issues from providing tax
relief to veterans and small businesses to combating
deed fraud to increasing oversight and accountability
over the city's tax expenditures, we've preserved
14,414 units of affordable housing across the five
boroughs, we created 3,354 units of affordable
housing and we created six business improvement

districts. The committee councils have prepared a
summary presentation of the committee's
accomplishments this session which each Council
Member can find at their desk in front of them. to
the Council's Finance Division your knowledge and
expertise and invaluable are invaluable to this
council and none of these victories I mentioned would
have been possible without your hand your hard work
and tireless dedication. Thanks to our incredible
Finance Director, Latonia McKinney, I could not have
asked for a better partner as we negotiated the last
four budgets and the numerous achievements we
received we achieved together have undeniably had an
enormous impact on the people of this city. It has
been a truly rewarding experience working with you
and developing a friendship that will last beyond my
time at the council. I also want to thank the staff,
our wonderful Finance Division staff; Deputy Director
and Chief Economist Dr. Ray Majeski, Deputy Director
Regina Poreda Ryan, Deputy Director Nathan Toth,
Deputy Director Paul Scimone, Assistant Director Emre
Edev, Finance Council Rebecca Chasan and Eric
Bernstein, Supervising Economist Paul Strum, the
Finance Unit Head Eisha Wright, Chima Obichere, John

It's been an honor to serve with you as your colleague, as your friend, as your sister, fellow women's caucus member, certainly there is so much we have in common chairing really important committees both finance and public safety and I am so proud of the work we've done collectively over the past four years. COUNCIL MEMBER JOHNSON: I want to congratulate you Julissa, its very exciting for you and your family after four years. I remember four years ago you had just had Julian after the 2013 election and to watch you chair this important committee and to be a mom and to navigate the balance between work life and family life while serving your constituents as Lori said working on complicated Land Use projects like Willets Point even after it was done or supposedly done I think really is a testament to you being a role model not just for women here who

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are elected but women who work here in the council and men who need to see strong women do these things so I want to just congratulate you and tell you I'm wishing you the best of luck and with that I vote aye.

recently I hope that you have felt my love and

because we're going to keep it open.
