2 RAFAEL: Testing 1 2, testing 1 2. This 3 is a test for the Committee on Youth Services. Today 4 is March 6, 2018. The meeting is being recorded by 5 Rafael Perez[phonetic].

6 CHAIRPERSON ROSE: The Youth Committee is 7 now called to order. Good afternoon, I am Council 8 Member Debbie Rose and I am the Chair of the 9 Committee on Youth Services. This morning, we are 10 also joined by Council Members Chin and King. Thank 11 you so much. Today will be the first vote for the 12 new session for the Committee on Youth Services. Ι 13 want to thank all my colleagues who have passed 14 legislation and participated in oversight hearings on 15 this committee in the past. Today we will be voting 16 on three pieces of legislation regarding runaway and 17 homeless youth or RHY. We will be voting on proposed 18 Intro 410A sponsored by Speaker Johnson which would 19 require DYCD to report annually on RHY while also 20 requiring DYCD to develop a plan to provide shelter 21 to all RHY who request shelter. Proposed Intro 490A 22 sponsored by Council Member Gibson would require that 23 RHY be permitted to remain in runaway homeless youth 24 shelters for extended time limits. Proposed Into 25 556A sponsored by Council Member Torres would require

2 DYCD to provide in its continual services, services to youth ages 21 through 24, commonly referred to as 3 homeless young adults. Runaway and homeless youth 4 are a particularly vulnerable population which many 5 6 of these youth having a variety of needs. The 7 legislation we are passing today is integral to what this committee has worked towards and will alleviate 8 the many stressors on runaway and homeless youth. 9 Ι 10 look forward to continuing to work on this issue as the new chair of this committee. None of the 11 12 sponsors are here and so I will now urge all my 13 colleagues to vote yes on all of these important bills and before I ask the clerk to call the vote, I 14 15 want to thank my staff and I want to thank Paul 16 Scinogol[phonetic] who is the counsel for this 17 committee, Kevin Cotoski[phonetic], the policy 18 analyst and Jessica Ackerman, our senior financial analyst, and with that I will now ask the clerk to 19 20 call the vote. COMMITTEE CLERK: William Martin, 21 2.2 Committee Clerk, roll call vote, Committee on Youth 23 Services, all items are coupled. Chair Rose? 24 CHAIRPERSON ROSE: I vote aye.

COUNCIL MEMBER KING: First I want to 9 thank Speaker Johnson, Council Member Torres and 10 11 Gibson for this piece of legislation that we're 12 voting on today. Understanding the challenges that 13 our young people are having in today's society, any 14 legislation that improves their quality of life also 15 serves as a commitment to a role path to a better 16 adulthood, I think is a good thing that we should 17 always focus on in the Council and in a day and age 18 where we know that some of our children still return home back at the ages of 24, 23 and 21, it's really 19 20 unconscionable to think that a child that's been in the system and when they turn 21 that they're ready 21 2.2 for adulthood when we know some of our own children 23 and our neighbors return back home who don't have, 24 are not living in a state of crisis so I think these

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1 COMMITTEE ON YOUTH SERVICES 6 2 are all good bills to help our next generations get it right and with that being said, I vote aye. 3 4 CHAIRPERSON ROSE: Thank you. 5 COMMITTEE CLERK: By vote of 3 in the affirmative, 0 in the negative and no abstentions, 6 7 all items have been adopted by the Committee. CHAIRPERSON ROSE: Thank you.
