MOHAMMAD ARSHAD (SP?): Test, test, test, this is a Committee Hearing on Land Use. Today's date is September 26, 2018. Being recorded by Mohammad Arshad (SP?). (gavel pounding).

CHAIR RAFAEL SALAMANCA: Alright good morning everyone. Welcome to the Committee on Land Use. I am Council Member Rafael Salamanca. I am the Chair of this Committee. I would like to welcome my colleagues to today's hearing. Today we have present Council Members, Gibson, Barron, Constantinides, Levin, Miller, Reynoso, Richards, Treyger, Grodenchik, Chair Adams, Diaz, Chair Moya, and Rivera. I would like to thank Chair Moya, Chair Adams and Chair Kallos for their work on our Land Use Subcommittees. Today we will be voting on an application referred out of our Landmarks Subcommittee. We will be voting to approve LU 151, the Landmark Preservation Commissions Designation of the Central Harlem West 130th to 132nd Street Historic District. The Historic District consists of approximately 164 properties. Primarily row houses located on West 130th, West 131st and West 132nd Street between Lennox and 7th Avenues. As a microcosm of

2	the African-American (INAUDIBLE) in greater Harlem,
3	the District is not only significant for its
4	contributions to the social and political history of
5	the immediate area but to the nation as a whole. It
6	has been home to an impressive (INAUDIBLE) of
7	cultural, religious, civic and political
8	organizations including the New Amsterdam Musical
9	Association which is the oldest African-American
10	Musical Association in the United States. The Alpha
11	Physical Culture Club, the first all-black athletic
12	club in the country and the planning headquarters for
13	the march on Washington for jobs and freedom in 1963.
14	This Historic District is in Council Member Perkin's
15	District. On September 17 th , the Landmark
16	Subcommittee voted to modify the designation to
17	exclude a parking garage located on the 161 st to 165 th
18	West 132 nd street; however, since the Landmarks are a
19	Committee vote we have had a number of discussions
20	where members of the community and the Council
21	Member. I would like to turn it over to the Chair of
22	the Landmark Subcommittee to speak on the discussions
23	that have taken plan since that vote. I would like
24	to recognize Chair Adams.

CHAIR ADRIENNE E. ADAMS: Thank you Chair
Salamanca. On August 17 th , the Landmark Subcommittee
held a public hearing on LU151, the designation of
the Central Harlem Historic District. At that
hearing, we received a lot of testimony in support of
the Historic District broadly and also testimony that
161 through 165 West 132 nd Street should be carved
out from the Historic District. The building in
question is a 4-story parking garage in a District
that is principally row houses and apartment
buildings. We heard concerns that rather include a
parking garage in the Historic District this property
would serve a better use if re-developed which we
understood would likely require Council review
because the site is very close to its maximum
allowable floor area ratio or FAR. The Committee
also heard testimony from community members and
Historic Preservation Groups urging us to affirm LPCs
Designation without modification. After the hearing,
the Committee received many calls from constituents
on both sides of the issue. Ultimately the Landmark
Subcommittee looks to the Council Member representing
the affected district for guidance in such matters.
At the time of the Landmark Subcommittee wete on

september 17, we voted to remove the garage for the
reasons I described above. Since that vote, Council
Member Perkins has strongly expressed his opposition
to modifying the designation and asked that we
maintain the boundaries as the Landmarks Commission
recommended. The designation of this District is
something that the community, Council Member Perkins
and the LPC staff have been working on for a number
of years. I want to personally acknowledge and
credit the hard work of numerous stakeholders in
Harlem for making their voices heard over many, many
years. To the residing community of the 9^{th}
District, I saw thank you for your passionate
perseverance in this matter. My colleagues and I
welcome the opportunity to get it right and with that
I will proudly vote to support your efforts to
maintain the boundaries of the entire Central Harlem
Historic District. (clapping).

CHAIR RAFAEL SALAMANCA: Thank you uhm Chair Adams. I would like to recognize Chair Perkins.

CHAIR BILL PERKINS: Thank you very much

I uhm want to enthusiastic support the Central Harlem

Historic District located in the mid-blocks of West 2 130th, West 131st, West 132nd Streets between Malcolm-X 3 Boulevard, Lennox Avenue and 7th Avenue in Manhattan. 4 I also believe emphatically; however, that the 5 commercial garage at 161 West 132nd Street built in 6 7 1910 should be included in this Landmark District designation. The proposed District also exhibits 8 high architectural merit. The proposed District's 9 largely intact group of late 19th Century buildings 10 tells the story of Harlem's speculative building boom 11 with row houses built primarily in the neo-Grec style 12 including work from architects such as Kleberdon 13 14 (SP?) and Putzel (SP?), Charles Baxter and William J. 15 Merit. This primarily row house district has a culture significance that for me and many of my 16 constituents is deeply felt. It is a remarkable 17 18 reminder of the powerful role that the African-American Community of Harlem played in creating 19 20 political and social change in New York City and the nation. Figures such as Jacob Lawrence, Famarick 21 2.2 Bearden (SP?) and Bayard Rustin (SP?) lived and 23 worked in the area. The New York, the National Headquarters of the 1963 march on Washington for jobs 24 and freedom was located here. I respect and work 25

with the Preservation community in many areas

including the city, More Beautiful in keeping his
