Dear Mr. Robles:

Pursuant to Section 37 of the New York City Charter, I hereby disapprove Introductory Number 331-A ("Intro. 331-A"), which would add a subchapter to the Administrative Code regulating and licensing the pedicab industry.

This Administration recognizes the need for legislation to regulate this fledgling industry and to establish basic safety requirements for the well-being of pedicab passengers and drivers, pedestrians and motor vehicles. Indeed, this Administration worked closely with the Council on the development of this bill, and agrees with its underlying framework. I believe it is important to require that all pedicabs be equipped with certain safety features and that they be inspected by the City prior to operation on City streets. I am also in agreement with the Council that pedicabs must comply with all state and local laws and rules governing bicycles. It is also appropriate to require each pedicab business to carry a policy of liability insurance.

While this Administration supports many provisions of Intro. 331-A, I cannot sign this legislation because I disagree with Intro. 331-A's imposition of a numerical cap on the number of pedicabs permitted to operate in the City.

Accordingly, I hereby disapprove Introductory Number 331-A.
