Affairs at HPD. HPD is here requesting the
following approvals: designation of a disposition
area as an urban development action area in the
Arverne East area. Also designation of the
amended project, amending something that was
passed by the Council in November 2003 as an Urban
Development Action area, or UDAP, Project and
approval of a UDAP tax exemption, which will
increase affordability across the entire project.
Wendell Walters, the Assistant Commissioner for

2 Housing Production at HPD, will give you the 3 particulars.

WENDELL WALTERS: Again, my name is Wendell Walters, Assistant Commissioner of Housing Production at HPD. As Carol mentioned, Land Use number 747 amends a project previously approved by City Council in November of 2003, Arverne East in the Far Rockaway section of Queens, owners LLC will construct up to 718 residential buildings containing up to 1,650 dwelling units, 300,000 square feet of commercial space, 3.3 acres of open space and 52.5 acres of public park land. building mix will include approximately 690 twoand three-family homes, 7 mid-rise cooperative buildings, 1 mid-rise rental and 20 four-story walk ups. We have been in extensive discussion with local council member, Council Member Sanders who has reviewed the project and indicated his support.

CHAIRPERSON KATZ: I thank you.

Just to point out, how many units of affordable housing?

MR. WALTERS: There's approximately 44% of the total project is going to be affordable

2	to 175% of AMI and lower.
3	CHAIRPERSON KATZ: How lower?
4	MR. WALTERS: We do have additional
5	lower tiers in that 44% at 80% and 130% as well.
6	CHAIRPERSON KATZ: Thank you.
7	Councilman Sanders, do you wish to make a comment?
8	COUNCIL MEMBER JAMES SANDERS, JR.:
9	Yes, I do. I want to thank you Madam Chair for
10	giving me the opportunity. I want to thank my
11	colleagues, especially for their sensitive ear on
12	this one. I do also want to take this time and
13	thank HPD, especially its assistant commissioner
14	Wendell Walters who had to put up with me. I want
15	to thank the Blue Stone Group and all of the
16	partners involved in this. I want to declare a
17	victory that 44% of this mega project will be
18	affordable and some of it, truly affordable. We
19	will also see commitments of a vocational school
20	being created through this. I'm looking for you
21	to read this into the record. I will yield on
22	those points. And then advisory board making sure
23	that the business representation reflects the
24	Queens community, especially my community. I will

yield at this point because I believe they have

3	CHAIRPERSON KATZ: Do you want to
4	read something into the record?
5	MR. WALTERS: That is correct.
6	After a lengthy discussion quite recently with the
7	Councilman, the development team has committed to
8	a goal of 20% local participation of minority
9	women and Queens based businesses for
10	participation in the construction of the project
11	out there. In addition, with much discussion
12	again, an advisory committee is to be established
13	to facilitate these goals, which the local council
14	seeks. Will have adequate representation, up to
15	one-third, of the advisory seats.
16	CHAIRPERSON KATZ: Anything else,
17	Councilman?
18	MR. SANDERS: I'm not sure if I
19	heard the vocational school aspect.
20	MR. WALTERS: Carol Clark will
21	speak to that point.
22	MS. CLARK: We want to thank you
23	Councilman Sanders for talking about the
24	vocational school, both in the short and the long
25	term. We are committed, the administration is

committed, we are fully committed to working with
you to implement that vocational training program
in the Rockaways. Thank you.
MR. SANDERS: Thank you very much.
I enjoy working with the administration. We must
do this more often. It is good to work with the
Committee.
CHAIRPERSON KATZ: Yes. You have
several projects, I believe, coming up for the
Rockaways, right?
MR. SANDERS: Yes. I look forward
to reconvening a team. But I do want to thank our
Chair for her patience and her diligence on this
issue also.
CHAIRPERSON KATZ: Thank you very
much.
MR. SANDERS: And I really want to
thank my colleagues around this table and others
for standing firm in making sure that the people
of the Rockaways, as we stand firm for the people
of New York. Thank you kindly.
CHAIRPERSON KATZ: Thank you. Is
there any other discussion on this item before I

close the hearing on this item? Councilman

Felder? 2 3 COUNCIL MEMBER SIMCHA FELDER: 4 quick note, I'm very excited about the vocational 5 training. Of course there are a lot of students, 6 including myself, that didn't have the patience to sit and vocational training would have done me a 7 8 lot of good. But now it's a little too late. 9 There's still time. MR. SANDERS: 10 MR. FELDER: Say it again. 11 MR. SANDERS: You are welcome to 12 the vocational school. 13 MR. FELDER: I think he's out of 14 order Madam Chair. Anyway. I just wanted to say 15 that I hope a day will come when non-public 16 schools also are able to benefit from government 17 funds for vocational training for all children in 18 the city. 19 CHAIRPERSON KATZ: Thank you very 2.0 much, Councilman. 5	824, is a contextual rezoning to protect the
6	character of five neighborhoods and allow housing
7	and retail development. It is a text amendment
8	and a map amendment in the Rockaway neighborhood
9	rezoning. It is in Community Board 14, Council
0	Members Addabbo and Sanders districts.

L.U. numbers 832 through 833 at 610 Lexington Avenue to facilitate the development of a 63-story mixed use building. It is a zoning text amendment and a special permit.

L.U. number 834 is a Hudson Yard's text amendment, motion to approve as modified and its amendment to the Hudson Yard's text amendment. That's it.

L.U. number 860 is Odoba Mexican Grill. It is in Council Member Quinn's district. It is a motion to file pursuant to referral by the applicant.

L.U. number 747 is in Council Member Sanders district and it is a UDAP to facilitate housing.
