CHAIRPERSON VALLONE: Okay, quiet							
please. Take seats. Okay. Welcome everyone to							
this long awaited public safety hearing. By way							
of explanation as to why it was supposed to start							
at 10:00. I was here at 10:00 and so were some of							
you. But we only have 11 members on the Committee							
and three of them are out of action today. Erik							
Dilan's wife is in labor and we wish them well.							
Joe Addabbo, after his hard fought victory, is							
celebrating in Disney World and Helen Foster is on							
her honeymoon. So everybody has good things							
happening, which means we had to herd cats, in							
this case literally, Melinda Katz, to get enough							
people in the room to have this vote. So and so,							
let me do a short version of this opening							
statement. We'll be voting on Intro 492-A, which							
will provide the council with greater insight as							
to the presence of guns in our communities.							
Rather than read this finely written opening							
statement by Oona, which I've looked at. It's							
basically what we're doing here is providing more							
transparency as we've done with this Committee							
many times in the past. We will now know, thanks							
to this bill, which was put in by Council Member

2	Yassky, where gun arrests are being made and where							
3	guns are being possessed in this city. And once							
4	we have that information we can then use it to							
5	continue to make our city safer. An informed City							
6	is a safer City. And this Committee has a long							
7	history of providing information to the public							
8	regarding crime. It was this Committee that put							
9	forth the crime in parks bill, which for the first							
10	time gave us crime in parks statistics; crime in							
11	schools bill, which put school crime on the web							
12	and gave us school crime; and there's many others							
13	like that and this has been a long tradition of							
14	getting more information so that the public can be							
15	safer. So, I would recommend an aye vote from							
16	everyone. And with that I'd like to turn it over							
17	to the bill's sponsor, David Yassky, with no							
18	microphone.							
19	COUNCIL MEMBER YASSKY: Thank you.							
20	First of all I would just like to corroborate that							
21	indeed the Chair was here at 10:00, ready and							
22	raring to go. So thank you, Mr. Chair, for your							
23	punctuality. Very simply, this is a common sense							
24	bill to add gun trafficking to the list of							
25	accountability measurements that the police

3	get the most out of the terrific Com Stat system						
4	on gun trafficking. And I thank you, Chair						
5	Vallone, for not just doing this today, but for						
6	all the work you've done in our time here on gun						
7	trafficking. Thank you.						
8	CHAIRPERSON VALLONE: Thank you,						
9	Council Member. With that, does anyone want to be						
10	heard before I open up for a vote. We will call						
11	the vote. Billy?						
12	WILLIAM MARTIN: William Martin,						
13	Committee Clerk. Introduction 492-A. Council						
14	Member Vallone?						
15	CHAIRPERSON VALLONE: I vote Aye.						
16	WILLIAM MARTIN: Gennaro.						
17	COUNCIL MEMBER GENNARO: Yes.						
18	WILLIAM MARTIN: Katz.						
19	COUNCIL MEMBER KATZ: Yes.						
20	WILLIAM MARTIN: Yassky.						
21	COUNCIL MEMBER YASSKY: Yes.						
22	WILLIAM MARTIN: Gentile.						
23	COUNCIL MEMBER GENTILE: Let me						
24	just say, Mr. Chair, that this bill mimics one of						
25	the bills that I had tried to pass, well, in the

3	never made it to the floor of the state senate.							
4	And so I wholeheartedly support Councilman							
5	Yassky's efforts and I vote Aye. Congratulations.							
6	WILLIAM MARTIN: Garodnick.							
7	CHAIRPERSON VALLONE: Did you want							
8	to say something, Yas?							
9	COUNCIL MEMBER YASSKY: Mr. Chair,							
10	I just wanted to comment, I think the chances of							
11	legislation like that moving in the state senate							
12	has increased dramatically. So I commend you for							
13	your foresight.							
14	COUNCIL MEMBER GARODNICK: All							
15	right and with that, I think that was worthwhile.							
16	I enjoyed it very much. I vote Aye. Thank you.							
17	WILLIAM MARTIN: Como.							
18	COUNCIL MEMBER COMO: Aye.							
19	WILLIAM MARTIN: By a vote of seven							
20	in the affirmative, zero in the negative and no							
21	abstentions, item is adopted. Members, please							
22	sign the committee report. Thank you.							
23	CHAIRPERSON VALLONE: We'll hold							
24	the vote open for a half hour for those members							
25	who have not shown up. And that adjourns this
