2	CHAIRPERSON WEPRIN: You're holding					
3	us up. Okay. [pause] Good afternoon, and					
4	welcome to today's Finance Committee hearing. My					
5	name is David Weprin, I chair the Committee.					
6	Today the Finance Committee will vote on three					
7	items, two budget modifications and one					
8	transparency resolution. Let's start first with					
9	the two budget modifications. The first budget					
10	modification is an expense modification, MN3.					
11	This modification implements expense budget					
12	appropriations, which were reflected in the City's					
13	November and January financial plan modifications.					
14	This modification also reallocates appropriations					
15	that were reflected in the Fiscal Year 2009					
16	adopted budget, to fund City Council local					
17	initiatives. The fund transfer totals \$1.2					
18	billion, but the net effect of this mod is zero.					
19	The next budget modification is a revenue					
20	modification, MN4, which reflects a \$136.8 million					
21	decrease in the City's revenue, revenues.					
22	Specifically the \$136.8 million reduction results					
23	from forecasted decreases in tax collections of					
24	\$724.4 million, and an \$85.3 million reduction in					
25	unrestricted aid from New York State.					

MALE VOICE: What about Finance, -

4 CHAIRPERSON WEPRIN: These 5 reductions are offset by \$500 million in savings 6 in prior year payables and an increase of \$175.98 million from miscellaneous sources. The net 7 8 reduction of \$136.8 million in tax revenue will reduce the City's general reserve by the same 9 10 amount. Keeping track of these amounts? There's 11 going to be a test later. Our last piece of 12 legislation relates to the adopted Fiscal 2008/209 13 expense budgets. In an effort to make the budget 14 process more transparent, this Committee will vote 15 on a Preconsidered Resolution approving the new designation and our changes in the designation of 16 17 organizations receiving funding the Fiscal 2008 18 and Fiscal 2009 expense budgets. Specifically, 19 the Preconsidered Resolution makes technical 20 corrections to the list of organizations 21 designated to receive funding in the Fiscal 2008 22 expense budget, and approves new designations 23 and/or changes in the designation of certain 24 organizations receiving Council discretionary 25 funding, and funding pursuant to certain

initiatives in the Fiscal 2009 expense budget. 2 3 Council Members should have the list of these new designations and changes, which is attached to the Resolution. For clarification purposes, it is to 5 be noted that organizations appearing in the 6 Resolution that have not yet completed the 8 prequalification process conducted by the Mayor's Office of Contract Services, or by the Council, 9 10 are identified in the attached charts with an 11 asterisk. Additionally, as with all transparency 12 resolutions, Council Members will have to sign a 13 disclosure form indicating whether or not a conflict exists with any of the groups on the 14 15 attached list. If any Council Member has a potential conflict of interest with any of the 16 17 organizations listed, he or she might want to 18 disclose the conflict at the time of their vote. 19 Members of Council Finance are available to answer 2.0 any questions you may have regarding the 21 transparency Resolution, and Noran Camp is 22 available to answer any questions you may have 23 regarding the conflict of interest disclosure 24 Stuart Klein from the Office of Management form. 25 and Budget is on hand to answer any questions you
