2	CHAIRPERSON GENNARO: I'm going to
3	start and read my statement just to get going.
4	Then by that time I'm certain that we'll have a
5	quorum. Sergeant, if you could start the tape.
6	Good afternoon and welcome. I'm Council Member
7	Jim Gennaro, Chair of the Committee on
8	Environmental Protection. Today we're holding a
9	hearing and a vote on three proposed bills to
10	address asbestos abatement and procedures, in the
11	wake of the Deutsche Bank fire on August 18, 2007.
12	On that fateful day, a fire in the former Deutsche
13	Bank Building caused by a discarded cigarette led
14	to the deaths of New York City firefighters Joseph
15	Graffagnino and Robert Beddia and resulted in
16	injuries to several others. Asbestos abatement
17	activities were taking place at that time and at
18	that time no smoking was permitted. These and
19	other findings, including problems with the safety
20	of asbestos abatement activity led Council Members
21	to pursue legislative solutions to the problems
22	being uncovered. The result of that inquiry is
23	these three bills before you today. Proposed
24	Intro 1001-A would prohibit smoking, carrying
25	tobacco or even carrying matches or lighters into

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an asbestos abatement workplace. On the day of the 130 Liberty Street fire, firefighters responded and assessed access issues but were delayed in their response activities due to the presence of wooden planking from the asbestos containment barriers in both stairwells, which also blocked the escape of two firefighters. Proposed Intro 1005 requires that the DEP commissioner, in consultation with the fire commission and the commissioner of buildings promulgate rules which give further guidance to contractors on how to maintain egress as asbestos projects in order to avoid a similar tragedy in the future. The existing abatement process allowed an abatement contractor to commence work on the date indicated regardless of the size or complexity of the job unless the rules required a variance. It was determined that an additional level of review should be required for certain Proposed Intro 1003-A establishes a threeiobs. point asbestos abatement protection program that will require permits for certain abatement jobs that pose the highest safety risk, mandate the use of fire retardant materials during the asbestos

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abatement process and authorize DEP inspectors to enforce provisions of the Fire and Building Codes at abatement sites, thereby adding to the safety of these projects for those in the building, the community and those required to respond in the event of an emergency. At this time, we'll entertain votes on these very important bills. I'd like to point out that this is legislation that was developed in consultation with the Bloomberg Administration. They were very helpful in getting us to this good day. I'd like to recognize the members that are here. Council Member White, Council Member Recchia, Council Member Ulrich, Council Member Crowley, and myself. That gives us five; that gives us a And we have Peter Vallone about to enter quorum. the room. Council Member James is here as well. I thank Council Member James for being here. of the bills I understand is a Council Member James' bill. Council Member James, do you wish to place a statement on the record before we take a vote.

COUNCIL MEMBER JAMES: Thank you,

Mr. Chair. I thank the members of this committee

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for voting on this bill. This legislation would prohibit smoking on any floor of a building where abatement activities are taking place. Further, this legislation would prohibit tobacco inside the workplace as such area is defined under DEP's asbestos control program sites. It codifies that which is already a recommendation within the industry. I thank you and I urge all of my colleagues to vote yes on this piece of legislation. Thank you, Mr. Chair.

CHAIRPERSON GENNARO: Thank you, Council Member James. I neglected to mention that you are the prime sponsor of Proposed Intro 1001-Forgive me. Let me complete the record and Α. say that the prime sponsors for Intro 1005 are Council Member Stewart and Speaker Ouinn. The prime sponsors for Intro 1003-A are Council Members Martinez, Gerson and the Speaker and many other members as well.
