COUNCIL MEMBER: [off mic] Good morning.

CHAIRPERSON SALAMANCA: Welcome to the Committee on Land Use. I am Council Member Rafael Salamanca, the Chair of this committee. I want to thank my esteemed colleagues who are members of the committee who are with us today. Today, we have Council Members Gibson, Barron, Deutsch, Chair Kallos, Koo, Reynoso, Richards, Treyger, Grodenchik, Chair Moya and Rivera. Today we will be voting on an applications referred out of our three subcommittees. This morning we will vote to approve LUs 218, the designation by Landmarks Preservation Commission of 550 Madison Avenue, a 30-story-37-story post-modern style skyscraper that served as the former AT&% headquarters as an individual landmark. From our Zoning Subcommittees we will vote to approve LUs 262 an application pursuant to Section 20-226 of the Administration-Administrative Code by 931 Manhattan, Café LLC d/b/a Citroen for a new revocable conrevocable consent to operate an unenclosed sidewalk café located at 931 Manhattan Avenue in Council

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Member Levin's district in Brooklyn. The applicant has agreed to reduce the size of the proposed unenclosed café to three tables and six chairs to accommodate the narrow sidewalk and existing sidewalk obstructions. We will vote to approve LUs 260 and application pursuant to Section 20-226 of the Administrative Code from By the Glass, Inc., d/b/a UVA for a renewal of a revocable consent to operate an unenclosed sidewalk café located at 1486 Second Avenue and LU 161 an application pursuant to Section 20-255 of the Administrative Code from Three Decker Restaurant, LTD for the renewal of a revocablerevocable consent to operate an enclosed sidewalk café located at 1746 2<sup>nd</sup> Avenue. Both are in Council Member Kallos' district in Manhattan. We will vote to approve LU 263 an application pursuant to Section 20-225 of the Administrative Code from 27 East Restaurant Holdings, LLC Fleming d/b/a Bilboquet for a revocable consent to operate and use and unenclosed sidewalk café located at 27 East 62<sup>nd</sup> Street in Council Member Powers' district in Manhattan. From our Planning Subcommittees, we will vote to approve LU 232 Park and Elton in my district in the Bronx, approval of this application for an amendment to a

2 previously approved Urban Development Action Area Project and a Private Housing Finance Law Tax 3 Exemption for property located at 3120 Park Avenue 4 and 45 East 159<sup>th</sup> Street would facilitate the 5 development of a 37-housing unit affordable to house 6 7 homes with incomes ranging from 27% AMI to 90% AMI including a six-homeless set-aside unit, which is 8 15%. We will also vote to approve LU 240 MEC 125<sup>th</sup> 9 Street, an application by HPD for a new Private 10 Housing Finance Law tax exemption for property known 11 12 as Parcel B West in Council Member Ayala's district I 13 Manhattan. The approval will facilitate the development of 404 residential units including 268 14 15 affordable and 134 market rate. More than 62,000 16 square foot of commercial space, 5,800 square foot for a cultural/community facility, 10,000 square feet 17 18 of public open space and 121 parking spaces. Are there any questions or remarks from members of the 19 20 committee? I just want to point out again my project. I know that many of my colleagues have-know 21 2.2 that I've introduced a bill that will require that 23 any developer that's getting any city subsidies from the city that there be a 50% homeless set-aside, and 24 to be quite frank, there's been resistance from the 25
